President Victor's Focus for 2020-2022

The following is a statement of objectives which I feel we need to prioritize going forward considering the current social, political, and spiritual climate. They are merely listed but not in any ascending or descending order of importance. I imagine that some of these ideas are already in the works or are long-standing ministry efforts of the Convention; however, the contemporary contexts mandates emphasis.

- A voting education, registration, and GOTV campaign emphasizing early voting for all elections.
- As the Census results come in, we need to have a push for BGC churches to emphasize participation and registration and follow the benefits that the Census produces.

- Mental Health Wellness Webinars
- History/Oral History Project to update the convention's illustrious history
- Committee on Inclusion to ensure and augment both gender and age inclusion
- On-line Tutoring developed across the state for students who must now learn in virtual classrooms
- Seminars/Webinars for developing an On-line presence for churches, especially in rural precincts
- Round-Table talks or even TED style talks from subject matter experts from the School of Theology and other places about what Church will look like in the future after the seismic shifts brought on by the pandemic

- Some effort to address food insecurity by pairing Black farmers with Black Churches to develop a distribution network
- Have discussion about developing a long-range strategic plan that is not personality/ presidentially driven to ensure the future direction of the Convention. With the tenure of the president being reduced to a two -year term, coupled with the quick shifts in context in the Commonwealth. we need direction for the Convention that outlast the presidency of any elected leader in order to maintain the Convention's relevance.





GROWING CHURCHES, and


