A hot lunch served at the Pickaway Senior Center at 11:30 AM on Monday, and at 12:00 noon Tuesday through Friday.

Homemakers:

Assistance with cleaning, laundry and running errands. Clients must meet certain eligibility criteria.

Meals on Wheels:

A hot lunch delivered to your home five days a week.

**National Family
Caregiver Support
Program:**

Respite and personal care, financial help with co-pays and medicine, utility bills, home repair. The care recipient must be over 60 years of age.

Supportive Services:

Assistance with Medicare & Medicaid papers, HEAP and Commodities paperwork.

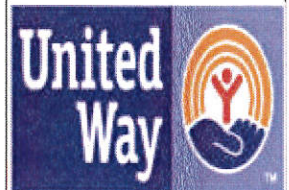
Transportation:

This Day in History: November

- November 1, 1512:** Michelangelo's paintings on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel were first exhibited to the public.
- November 2, 1959:** Charles Van Doren, a game show contestant on the NBC-TV program "Twenty-One" admitted that he had been given questions and answers in advance.
- November 3, 1900:** The first automobile show in the United States opened at New York's Madison Square Garden.
- November 4, 1981:** The second scheduled flight of the space shuttle Columbia was canceled with only 31 seconds left in the countdown.
- November 5, 1940:** U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt won an unprecedented third term for office.
- November 6, 1923:** Jacob Schick was granted a patent for the electric shaver.
- November 7, 1874:** The Republican Party was first symbolized as an elephant in a cartoon by Thomas Nast in "Harper's Weekly."
- November 8, 1956:** After turning down 18,000 names, the Ford Motor Company decided to name their new car the "Edsel," after Henry Ford's son.
- November 9, 1984:** A bronze statue titled "Three Servicemen" by Frederick Hart was unveiled at the site of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, DC.
- November 10, 1969:** "Sesame Street" debuted. In 2018, it was estimated that 86 million Americans had watched the series as children.
- November 11, 1868:** The first indoor amateur track-and-field meet was held by the New York Athletic Club.
- November 12, 1940:** Disney released "Fantasia," their longest animated feature. The world premiere happened the next day.
- November 13, 1995:** Greg Maddox of the Atlanta Braves became the first major league pitcher to win four consecutive Cy Young Awards.
- November 14, 1968:** Yale University announced it was going co-educational after 267 years.
- November 15, 1926:** The National Broadcasting Co. (NBC) debuted with a radio network of 24 stations. The first network radio broadcast was a four-hour "spectacular."
- November 16, 1952:** In the "Peanuts" comic strip, Lucy held a football for Charlie Brown for the first time.

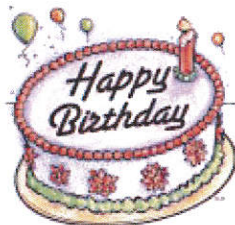

- November 17, 1982:** The Empire State Building was added to the National Register of Historical Places.
- November 18, 1985:** Joe Theismann of the Washington Redskins broke his leg after being hit by New York Giant Lawrence Taylor. The injury ended Theismann's 12-year NFL career.
- November 19, 1998:** Vincent van Gogh's "Self-Portrait without Beard" sold at auction for more than \$71 million.
- November 20, 1986:** The one billionth Little Golden Book was printed. The title was "The Poky Little Puppy."
- November 21, 1980:** About 83 million viewers tuned in to find out "who shot J.R." on the CBS prime-time soap opera "Dallas." (Kristin did it.)
- November 22, 1977:** Regular passenger service on the supersonic Concorde jet began between New York and Europe.
- November 23, 1889:** The first jukebox made its debut at the Palais Royale Saloon in San Francisco.
- November 24, 1969:** The Apollo 12 command module splashed down safely in the Pacific Ocean, ending the second manned mission to land on the moon.
- November 25, 1961:** The Everly Brothers were inducted into the U.S. Marine Corps Reserves.
- November 26, 1942:** The motion picture "Casablanca" had its world premiere at the Hollywood Theater in New York City.
- November 27, 1779:** The College of Pennsylvania became the University of Pennsylvania. It was the first legally recognized university in America.
- November 28, 1977:** Larry Bird was introduced as "College Basketball's Secret Weapon" with a cover story in "Sports Illustrated."
- November 29, 1981:** At the age of 43, actress Natalie Wood drowned in a boating accident off of Santa Catalina Island, CA.
- November 30, 1971:** ABC-TV aired "Brian's Song." The movie was about Chicago Bears' Brian Piccolo and his friendship with Gale Sayers.

**HEAP Winter Crisis Program Applications Available**

The Home Energy Assistance Winter Crisis Program (HEAP) helps income eligible Ohioans that are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected or have less than a 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank.

The program runs from Nov. 1, 2020 until May 1, 2021. A household applying for HEAP must report total gross household income from the past 30 days (12 month preferred) for all members, except wage or salary income earned by dependent minors under 18-years-old. Both homeowners and renters are eligible. To apply online, visit [energyhelp.ohio.gov](http://energyhelp.ohio.gov). Applications are available at the Pickaway Senior Center. For more information call the Center at 740-474-8831.

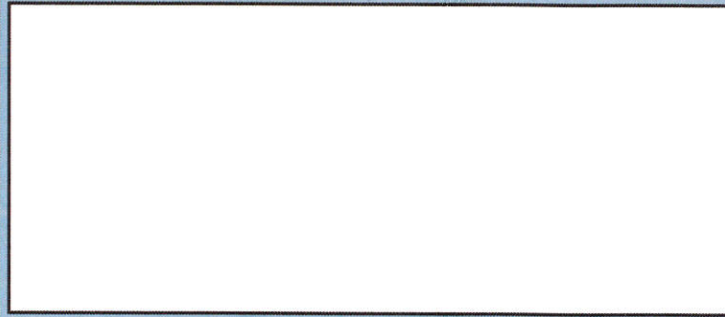
