I pray that this message would find its place in your hearts and that it would bear roots and grow fruits, in the Mighty name of Jesus Amen.

There has been a lot of prophetic words spoken over the prison systems by many Pastors on Pando: House of Rest Church, Pastor Rocha, has stated many of times along with brother Jermey and sister Eve on Real Vida, that God is raising an army of generals inside of the prison system. And we are ALL parts of that prophetic word. I once heard on Real Vida radio podcast, a minster had a vision. At the end of the vision the Lord tells the minister in his vision "Tell My people that great treasure is behind these walls. In these forgotten vessels, My people must come forth and touch these ones for a mighty anointing will be unleashed upon these for future victory in My kingdom and they must be restored." This is speaking of me and you, brothers and sisters, but it is up to us to respond.

In Revelation 3:14-21 (KJV), Jesus says, "And unto the angel of the church of the Landfeatus write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God; I know thy works, that then art neither cold nor hot. I would then wart cold or hot. So then because then art intervents, and neither cold nor hot, I will spus thee out of My month. Because then sepast, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that then art wretshed, and misorable, and poor, and blind, and neited: I counsel thee to buy of Me gold tried in the fire, that then mayest be rich; and white reliment, that then mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy neitedness do not arreser; and anoint thine over with averable, that then mayest see.

As many as I love, I rebute and chesten: be zealous therefore, and repent. Schold, I stand at the door, and knock: If any man hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me. To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with Me in My throne, even as I also overcome, and am set down with My Father in His throne.*

The Church of Laodicea is being spoken of here, the church was complacent, and this is written to the church corporately and individually. The church was lukewarm and because of that a warning was given to tighten up or get spued out. We have to repent from our complacency as a church individually and corporately. We are the church, the Spirit of God dwells in each and every single one of us, upon being reborn. We cannot become complacent when God is moving and pouring out His Spirit upon us and these units. It is time for us to respond.

In Revelation 3:20, Jesus says, "I stand at the dear and threat and that If any IMAN hours My votes and agains the dear ..." Put your hand on your heart, do you fell that thump? Every heartbeat that beats in your chest is Jesus knocking on the door of your heart. But it is up to you how you are going to respond. Are you going to invite Him in so that He can do what He has to do in and through you? When that heartbeat stops there are no more chances. Some of us have opened the door but have not invited Him in. Imagine opening the door to a visitor and then just standing there looking at them, in silence. We do not know when the heartbeat is going to stop, so answer the knock and invite Him in, so that He can come in and fellowship with you. Now notice, again, what Jesus says in Verse 21, "I will some in to thim, and will say with him, and he with Ma."

Let's read another parable where Jesus teaches about this same invitation, now here in Luke 14:16-24, together, "A cartain man gave a great suppor and invited many, and sent his servant at suppor time to say to those who ware invited, "Come, for all things are now ready." But they all with one accord began to make excuses. The first said to him, "I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused." And another said, "I have bought five yoke of exen, and i am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused." Still another said, "I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come." So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the mester of the house, being angry, said to his servant, "So out quickly into the streak and lance of the city, and bring in here the poor and the mained and the iame and the blind." And the servant said, "Waster, it is done as you commended, and still there is room." Then the mester said to the servant, "So out into the highways and hedges, and compal them to come in, that my house may be filled. For I say to you that none of those men who were invited shall taste my suppor."

The pre invited guests is referring to the people of Israel, but they rejected the invitation. Then, **Verse 18** states that they even began to make excuses. What excuses do we make for not responding to the knock? Are we at the door telling Jesus, "Hold on let me get my house in order." No! He will do the ordering. Or did we open the door, but just stand there looking at Him? When the heartbeat stops there's no more chances.

Now, let's read Matthew 22:1-14, together, "And Jesus answered and spoke to them again by parables and said: "The bringdom of heaven is like a contain bring who arranged a marriage for his son, and sont out his servants to

call those who were invited to the wedding; and they were not willing to come. Again, he sent out other servants, saying, "Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner; my owen and latted cattle are killed, and all things are ready. Come to the wedding," But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm, another to his business. And the rest seized his servants, treated them spitabilly, and killed them. But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding." So those servants went out into the highways and gathered tegether all whom they found, both had and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests.

But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment. So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and east him into outer darkness; there will be weaping and gueshing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."'

Here in this text, instead of making excuses, they just rejected the invitation. There in **Mattew 22:14**, the word "excliss" is a universal call to repentance and faith in the finished works of Jesus Christ. This call is to all who will hear the Gospel; however, many hear it and few respond to it.

In Matthew 7:13-14 (NIV), again we read these encouraging words from Jesus, "Enter through the narrow gets. For while is the gate and bread is the read that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the read that leads to the, and only a few find it." Sadly, in our environment today, it is easier for us to go with the grain, and this path, as we all may have experienced, leads only to destruction. The 'path of life' is when we go against the grain, it's not going to be easy, but the reward is eternity (forever is a long time) in His presence, choose today which way you will go.

Those who respond to this call become God's chosen. We do not need to be Bible scholars to answer and respond to the calling. Listen here how Paul explains, in 1 Corinthians 1:26-31, "Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, so that no one may boast before Him. It is because of Him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. Therefore, as it is written: 'Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord.'" Chosen means to be selected for oneself.

Paul, again, here in Ephesians 1:4-6, states, "For He chose us in Him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. In love He predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with His pleasure and will— to the praise of His glorious grace, which He has freely given us in the One He loves." In our being chosen we see here that we are selected for a sovereign purpose, "Before the creation of the world."

Let's continue and read 1 Peter 2:4-10, "As you come to Him, the living Stone - rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to Him - you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priest-hood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For in Scripture it says: 'See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in Him will never be put to shame.' (Isaiah 28:16) Now to you who believe, this Stone is precious. But to those who do not believe, 'The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,' (Psalm 118:22) and, 'A stone that causes people to stumble and a rock that makes them fall.' (Isaiah 8:14) They stumble because they disobey the message - which is also what they were destined for. But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

I've added in the other Old Testament Scripture references for your further study. As you study those Scriptures, they will also take you to other New Testament Scriptures concerning this same message.

Notice there in Verse 9, it says that we ARE chosen to proclaim the excellencies of Him, to proclaim His name. Now that we are a chosen people for a sovereign purpose, how are we going to respond? It is time for us to lay aside our agenda for His, it's time to choose His way of life, so that He can live in and through us. This choosing is not based on our own merit, or because we are a special people. It is based on His choosing to knock on the door, and us responding and inviting Him into our lives. In John 15:16, Jesus assures us. **You and another chooses his, but I always you and appointed

Give and It Will Be Given Back to You By H.A.M.

I've been trying to clarify to our Chaplin here, why I firmly believe that the New Testament doesn't exclude giving tithes and offerings. IF the 10% tithe had been abolished by Jesus, it would have been stated in no uncertain terms via His Word, right?

"The Lord saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the time. The Lord regretted that He had made human beings on the earth, and His heart was deeply troubled ... But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord. This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God." (Genesis 6:5-6, 8-9)

Once you begin to understand how much God loves you, your love for Him will naturally increase. You'll want to give to Him and bless Him. You'll want to do all that you can to express your affection and gratitude towards the One who has done so much for you. But what can you give God, who is already the Creator and possessor of everything? How can you bless the source of all blessings? Well, you can walk with Him by faith. You can be one of those rare people who honors Him by believing what He says and stand fast on His Word, even when it contradicts what is seen in the natural world. Despite the taunts of the devil and the criticism of skeptics, this person says, "I believe my heavenly Father. I have His Word, and I will trust it no matter what happens, I will not let go!"

There were probably no storm clouds in the sky either, or no indication in the natural world that God's warning would ever come to pass, but Noah wasn't moved by any of that. Amos 7:1-9:15

Psalms 131:1-3

Such contentment gives us security so that we no longer have to prove ourselves to others.

From Abraham, Moses, Gideon, Elijah, Daniel, the twelve disciples and the Apostle Paul, among many more, these great men of God were called for His purpose. When the first disciples of Jesus were called, as we read here in *Mark 1:16-17*, it was for a purpose, "As Jesus walked by the sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Game fallow Wig." Jesus said, "and I will make you fisher of man." At once they left their nets and followed Him." Today, Jesus still needs followers, not just believers. Too many believers stop to count the cost. I say this not to scare you, but to show you the requirement. Just know we go in His strength, we follow in His strength, but it's going to cost us total submission to His calling to follow Him.

Let's listen how Jesus explains "the cost", here in Luke 14:25-35, "Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them He said: "If anyone comes to like and does not hate father and mother, with and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be lify disciple. And wheever does not early their cross and follow life cannot be lify disciple. Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first all down and astimate the cost to see if you have enough maney to complete life For If you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish."

Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will est for terms of peace. In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be My disciples.

Salt is good, but if it loses its salthess, how can it be made salty again? It is lit neither for the sell nor for the manure plie; it is thrown out. Whoever has cars to hear, let them hear.**

In those days, a criminal had to carry their own cross to the place of execution, showing submission and to warn others to submit to the Roman government. The people in the crowd along with the disciples knew what carrying the cross meant. Sometimes it gets heavy, we get tired and worn out, but we never must drop it and quit, we have to persevere, we have to fight the good fight of faith.

In Mark 8:34-38, again Jesus, we read, "Then He called the crowd to Him along with His disciples and said: "Whosever wants to be thy disciple must deay themselves and take up their cross and follow life. For whosever wants to save their life will lose it, but whosever loses their life for the and for the Gospal will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfall their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? If anyone is estimated of the and thy words in this adultarous and sinful generation, the Son of then will be astroned of them when He comes in His Father's glary with the hely anguls." Here, the reference in Verse 34, "If anyone wishes to come after Me" means that we must walk the path which He walked. The path of self-denial and bearing our own cross. The cross is the symbol of suffering. So, what does the cross represent? Death to self, and beyond. Are we ready to lay it all on the line for the sake of the kingdom, unto the point of death.

In Philippians 3:4-6, Paul gives his "pedigree", in the flesh, "though I myself have reasons for such confidence. If someone else thinks they have reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless."

Listen closely, here in *Philippians 3:7-11*, as Paul begins to, with the help of the Holy Spirit and his new personal understanding, impart to us this descriptive picture, "But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of His resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead." In Verse 10 we can see that He knew He would have to suffer for the sake of the Gospel. Are we ready to suffer for someone else? Well, Jesus suffered for us. We are currently in a state of suffering, but for the wrong reasons. Let's be ready to suffer for Christ. Storms are coming, persecution, tribulation, suffering, trials are coming.

But God, right, but God provides Hope, that Hope has a name, and His name is Jesus Christ.

Now, John 16:33, Jesus encourages us with, "I have tald you those things, so that in the you may have peace in this world you will have trouble. But take heard I have evereone the world." Remember back there in Mark 8:35, where Jesus stated, "For wheever wants to save their life will lose it, but wheever loses their life for the gospal will save it." I guess my question right here is, which life do you want to hold on to, the old life you are hanging onto or eternal life? If we are completely devoted to holding on to this life, we will miss the life that is forever in His presence. This life, this world, is fading away and will one day disappear, but eternal life is forever. One life leads to eternity in His presence, the other alternative/eternity WILL BE in a place where there is "weaping and greating of the tall" (Matthew 13:42). That place also has a name, and it's Hell!

Paul was sold out for the Gospel, and he was so devoted to the mission that he was willing to lose his life. Reflect, for a moment, back to *Mark 8:36*, where Jesus was expressing, "What is the value of challing all the placeures of the world, if a parson dies and cannot enjoy it."

John records in 1 John 2:15-17, "Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in them. For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—comes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever." I truly do not believe that John is saying that we shouldn't have nice things. What I do believe he is encouraging us with is that our hearts are not 'seeking after and storing up a warehouse full of earthly treasures for a few short years, if it means the loss of eternal life.' We should be seeking eternal treasures, things like soul-winning and discipling others so that they grow and mature for kingdom business. Imagine hearing, "well done good and faithful servant," this is what we should be seeking after.

Verse 38 of Chapter 8 of Mark: to be ashamed, is to deny Christ rather than own Him or follow Him. We may face a time when we have to renounce Christ and live or accept Him and face death, to do the former is like if we are taking a stand with this adulterous and sinful generation instead of with Christ.

Luke 9:57-62 — "As they were walking along, someone said to Jesus, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' But Jesus replied, Taxas have done to live in, and birds have nests, but the San of Man has no place even to lay his hand." He said to another person, "Come, follow Ma." The man agreed, but he said, 'Lord, first let me return home and bury my father.' But Jesus told him, "Let the spiritually dead bury their even dead! Your duty is to go and preach about the language of Gad." Another said, 'Yes, Lord, I will follow you, but first let me say good-bye to my family." But Jesus told him, "Anyone who puts a hand to the play and then leads back is not fit for the Kingdom of Gad."

So what does Jesus want from us? To be sold out, all in for His name's sake. The same way we were sold out for the streets, the world and this life in prison. A verse in a secular song states, "There is no half way crooks" our Father does not want halfhearted commitment. No lukewarm Christians or churches, for the Word of God says He will spit us out. NIV Bible commentary "We cannot pick and choose among Jesus' ideas and follow Him selectively, we have to accept the cross along with the crown. We must count the cost and be willing to abandon everything else that has given us security--without looking back. With our eyes on Jesus, we should allow nothing to distract us from following Him." Amen!

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
