Biography

Garth Squires Popour (loving known as Gary), 86 of Port Hope, passed away unexpectedly, Wednesday March 26, 2025. Gary was born in Thompson, Michigan, on June 13, 1938. His family moved to Harbor Beach when he was 10 years old. He joined the U.S. Navy at the age of 17, where he was assigned to the Amphibious

Force and later became a disbursing clerk. After being discharged, he worked alongside his dad on the construction of I-75 for several years, and the General Motors in Pontiac. He later moved to Port Hope where he farmed and operated an adult foster care home with his wife, Alanda Martha Reinke. Gary and Martha were united in marriage on April 11, 1964 and celebrated their 60th Wedding anniversary just last year. Gary was a proud member and elder of the Sault Tribe of Chippewa Indians, a devoted member and ordained priest of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, where he performed multiple baptisms, funerals and weddings. He gave the gift of life through organ donation. He had always wanted 12 children, but was blessed with three: Garth W. (Shannon) Popour, Lisa (Duane) Pleiness, and Dawn Deer.
