


The 3rd annual Oktoberfest is scheduled for Sat. October 11th.



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children

In today's Gospel, Jesus is trying to help us understand how God wants us to live.

The rich man wore expensive clothes and ate fancy food that someone else cooked for him. The poor man, Lazarus, was so poor and sick that all he could do was sit and beg for help. Jesus tells us that God wants us to do something more. He wants us to look around to notice the people who are hurting like Lazarus and to help them.



For example, you might notice someone on the playground who has no one to play with and ask them to join you. If someone is eating lunch alone, sit with them or ask them to sit with you and your friends. Your




