## Vestry Update:

Over the summer, Barb Clonch resigned from the vestry and at the September meeting and Cathy Fadden was appointed to fill the remainder of Barb's term. We would like to thank Barb for her service on the vestry. She has been very helpful in many aspects of the church, and her dedication to All Saints' is greatly appreciated.

Buildings and grounds issues continue to plague the church. The torrential rain we experienced in June created additional dampness in the basement. Even though the dehumidifiers were running all summer there was still a lot of clean up that needed to be done before Head Start could resume classes. OCO paid to have an environmental company come in and clean up the area. It is now fresh and bright; a safe and welcoming place for the children who use the building every day.

Additional building issues include: the broken railings on the ramp to the kitchen; the finish on the exterior doors; the structural deterioration above the parish hall door entrance; and the chapel/church roof. Ed Rauch has fixed the railings at a huge cost savings to the church. We should investigate the cost to have them repainted as they are looking rather sad! We have a craftsman willing to strip and refinish the doors (one at a time), but this requires him to remove each door and take it back to his shop. To do this we need measurements of the existing doors so that he can build a barrier when the door is removed. We are also investigating an insurance claim for the roof repairs, more information will follow.

Financially we have remained in the black all year. Thank you to everyone for keeping up on your pledges!
