EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 7:45 p.m., Mr. Piazza moved and Mr. Scott seconded to adopt Resolution #17-55, to enter into an executive session to discuss contract matters, litigation and personnel. All in favor, motion carried.

At 7:58 p.m., Mr. Rosenberg moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded to return to open session. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Wauhop asked Mr. Sipes to give a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the paving projects at the Oxford STP and Warren Haven 1 & 2 Pump Stations. The presentation also displayed the fencing installed at the Warren Haven Pump Stations, as well as what the rehab project entailed.

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Olshefski presented the resolution and certification for adoption of the FY2018 Capital Budget (\$250,000) and Operating Budget (\$2,787,191). The figures are the same as the resolution passed in October for introduction of the budget. The DCA has approved it without any changes. He recommended the budget be passed.

As far as the November financial report, we are in a better financial position than anticipated. There is still one more month of activity. Mr. Olshefski stated the MUA is in good shape heading into the new year.

Our current CD rate is 1.57%; rates have been going up.

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A connection fee for \$6,642 was received from NJ American Water.

Yesterday, at the PCFA meeting, the coordination of Pilot Study was discussed. Mr. Wauhop and Mr. Donati attended the meeting.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #17-56, for the adoption and certification of the FY2018 Annual Operating Budget and Capital Budget/Program. Mr. Scott seconded, and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Chairman Chamberlain presented resolutions for the amendment of the Authority's Rules and Regulations and the Connection Fee.

Ms. Napolitani moved to adopt Resolution #17-57, for the amendment of the Authority's Service Rules to incorporate the changes in user fees set at \$11.36 for residential users and \$22.72 for industrial users per Appendix C, and to retain the current connection fee rate of \$6,642.00 per EDU for FY2018, as discussed at the Annual Rate Hearing. Mr. Scott seconded, and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Ms. O'Connor moved and Mr. Scott seconded to adopt Resolution #17-58, which sets the Connection Fee for FY2018. The fee remains at \$6,642 per EDU. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Next, Chairman Chamberlain presented a resolution for the appointment of Auditor for FY2018.

Mr. Rosenberg asked why the Authority did not get any other proposals for auditing services. Ms. Napolitani stated that we did not request RFPs, although it is a good business practice. Chairman Chamberlain suggested doing it the following year.

Mr. Rosenberg moved to adopt Resolution #17-59, authorizing the appointment of Nisivoccia & Company, LLP, to provide the professional services of auditor for FY2018. Ms. O'Connor seconded, and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Olshefski and Mr. Francisco wished everyone a good holiday and then left the meeting.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Aside from discussion in Executive Session, Mr. Tipton had nothing further to report.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Donati distributed his report prior to the meeting.

Sewer Extensions: There is correspondence regarding the proposed development in Washington Township. Mr. Donati stressed the importance of staying informed about the progress of this development, to insure they pay their connection fees to this Authority. The developer's

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engineer called Mr. Donati about how to fill out the TWA application. Mr. Donati explained the Authority's process for an application. He followed up with a letter explaining our fees and process. Since we are the receiving facility, we must endorse their TWA before it gets approved. No response has been received.

Mr. Rosenberg recommended obtaining the minutes from the Washington Township Zoning Board.

NJ American Water: They submitted their connection fee and plans.

Oxford WWTP NJPDES Permit Renewal: We received the draft permit for review and comments. Mr. Donati explained the draft in more detail and his concerns. On behalf of the Authority, CP Engineers submitted formal comments.

Oxford Upgrade Phase 2: The Final Payment Application has been received. All paperwork has been submitted and approved. Closeout of this project leads to the closeout of the NJEIP loan. The Authority is waiting for instructions on how to close out the loan in light of the situation with Tomar Construction Services.

Mr. Wauhop gave his recommendation on how he would like to see the loan closed out. The State is anxious to close this out.

Warren Haven Pump Stations Rehab, Contract #15-03: The Final Payment Application has been received. All paperwork has been submitted and approved.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report prior to the meeting.

Belvidere plant: He recapped maintenance items performed during the month. The #2 pump at the Water Street Pump Station was opened and rags were removed. Unclogged the storm drain at the plant, replaced the UV lamp on the #1 UV bank, and greased all the process pumps.

Oxford plant: Mr. Wauhop recapped maintenance items performed during the month. Put new extension poles on the new rakes that remove rags from the bar grate. Hodge Electric installed a new Pulsar Meter on the Hypochlorite Tank in the filter building. Due to hunters being on our property, "No Trespassing" signs were installed in the wooded areas. The hose pumps at the caustic tank, sodium bi-sulfate and aluminum chloride tanks were replaced.

Under general business, Mr. Wauhop and Mr. Donati attended PCFA's meeting to present recommendations for the Pilot Study. The resolution from our last meeting was also discussed. PCFA was concerned with the last item of the resolution, where we wanted a guarantee from them that they would send us all the future leachate that we could accept. Their concern was that they did not know what we would charge them. Mr. Wauhop suggested that after we determine

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the amount we could accept, two of our commissioners could meet with two of theirs to negotiate the final rate.

Mr. Wauhop asked for the Board's permission to inform PCFA that Item 5 of the resolution will be eliminated, and we will negotiate the final rate in the future, based on the results of the Pilot Study. The Board gave their okay.

The new Ford F250 truck is at the dealership and arrangements must be made for payment and pickup. Mr. Wauhop asked for permission to cut a check and pick up the truck the next day. Ms. Napolitani moved and Mr. Rosenberg seconded to prepare a check in the amount of \$27,397 made payable to Smith Motor Company, and have Mr. Wauhop arrange for its pick up. All in favor, motion carried.

Work continues on obtaining a climbing screen for the Belvidere STP. This will need to go out for public bid.

The Authority's collection systems have not been inspected in a while. Mr. Wauhop recommended that CP Engineers find out what it would cost to inspect all our collection systems via a video camera.

Installation of the main control panel on the sand filter at the Belvidere STP is 99% complete.

Mr. Wauhop presented a resolution for appointment of our risk manager for 2018.

Mr. Rosenberg moved to adopt Resolution #17-60, reappointing Sharon Cooper of Public Entity Advocates as our Risk Management Consultant for 2018. Mr. Piazza seconded. The motion pass unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Wauhop presented the resolution and agreement authorizing the award of a non-fair and open contract for professional services for laboratory testing to New Jersey Analytical Laboratories (NJAL) for one year.

Mr. Scott moved to adopt Resolution #17- 61, awarding the non-fair and open contract for the professional services of laboratory testing to New Jersey Analytical Laboratories for one year. Mr. Piazza seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Under personnel, Mr. Wauhop asked the Personnel Committee for its recommendation for a 2% raise for 2018 for all employees.

Ms. Napolitani moved and Mr. Scott seconded to give all employees a 2% pay increase for 2018. All in favor, motion carried.

FINANCE (Treasurer)

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #17-62 (Certificate No. 377: \$103,449.07) be approved to pay

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all bills from the Operating Fund, as presented. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #17- 63 (Certificate No. 385: \$104,615.13) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund as presented. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on roll call vote.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

Chairman Chamberlain wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year,

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Scott moved and Mr. Kiszonak seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:37 p.m.

AMENDING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY TO INCORPORATE ANNUAL ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AUTHORITY'S FEE AND CHARGES FOR SEWER CONNECTIONS AND FOR SEWER TREATMENT SERVICES AND TO PROVIDE OTHER RATE AND FEE CHANGES.

WHEREAS, the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority (the Authority) has adopted rules and regulations entitled Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority - Service Rules (Rules and Regulations) pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:14B-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has the right and obligation to change or amend, from time to time, its Rules and Regulations in order that they should continue to reflect the current operating requirements of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, public notice of the Authority's annual rate hearing as required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:14B-23 was timely provided; and

WHEREAS, on December 19, 2017, the Authority conducted a public hearing on its rates and fees and is of the opinion that the proposed revision to the connection fees and user rates should be adopted, and that the Rules and Regulations should be amended to reflect the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. A new Appendix C to the Authority's Rules and Regulations shall be included therein as follows:

APPENDIX C

WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY SCHEDULE OF SEWAGE TREATMENT SERVICE CHARGES AND CONNECTION FEES:

1. General:

The Authority hereby sets forth the current applicable sewage treatment charges and connection fees as adopted by the Authority in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40:14B-22 and 23.

A) An additional 11% Inflow & Infiltration (I&I) factor shall be assessed on all users billed on a metered flow basis (either water use or sewer discharge), with the exception of Belvidere and Oxford whose metered flow includes system-wide I&I, in order to establish equitable allocation of system-wide I&I.

B) <u>Sewage Treatment Services FY2018</u>

Class of User Rates

-Residential \$11.36 per billing unit
-Industrial \$22.72 per 1,000 gallons

C) Connection Fees FY 2018*

The FY 2018 connection fee shall remain unchanged from 2017. The current amount of \$6,642.00 per EDU (equivalent dwelling unit) is less than the calculated amount of \$9,466.00.

* Affordable housing projects built by Public Housing Authorities and non-profit organizations will receive a reduction of 50% in connection fees, pursuant to C40:14B-22.

- 2. The foregoing amendment to the Rules and Regulations shall take effect as of December 19, 2017, the date of its adoption by a majority of the Members of the Authority, and this Resolution shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the amendment was approved by a majority of the Members of the Authority at that time.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Rules and Regulations of the Authority shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
