Your Hometown Church Faithful to Tradition Loving in Fellowship Reaching for Tomorrow

In 1735 John Wesley, the man who became a key founder of the Methodist movement, traveled to Savannah, in the province of Georgia with the intention of evangelizing Native Americans. This was 20 years before the French and Indian war and long before the formation of the United States. He traveled to Georgia at the request of James Oglethorpe, who had founded the colony, and who wanted John to be the colonies new minister. In February of 1736 Wesley arrived in Savannah ready to convert the "savage" Native Americans. However, in a journal entry from January of 1738 John Wesley wrote, "I went to America to convert the Indians; but oh, who shall convert me?"

How do we restrain from the savior complex, the idea that we save people or we have all the answers? The truth is we do not have all the answers. We don't even have most of the answers. At least we do not live like we have the answers. If we were to take a broad look at Christianity across the United States, our morality, if it differs at all from the general populous, is only marginally different. Christians misuse power, we cheat on spouses, we get divorces, we profit off the manipulation or mistreatment of others, we celebrate violent tendencies, we applaud political victories at the expense of others, we fail to care for people, we...it turns out, are sinful, just like all those we would hope to evangelize. The point of this is not to make us feel guilty about our hypocrisy, it is to help us realize we are not morally superior than those without Christ. The difference is we know about grace which gives us joy for the present and hope for the future. Which brings us to the point of evangelism. Evangelism is about sharing the good news with love

This encounter highlights for me one of the great struggles within Christianity. On one hand Christians have knowledge of something that can save other's souls and transform their lives; while on the other hand, we remain wholly hesitant to allow our own lives to be transformed. We are called to help direct others to the light while we ourselves hide in the darkness. There is a natural unease to the work of evangelism because evangelism requires Christians to believe they have an answer that others are lacking. This inevitably creates a sense of superiority. We think we are better than others because we have a certain knowledge, the most important knowledge, and knowledge we are told is power. We do not mean to act superior. More often than not we strive to be humble, and to lower ourselves in service the way Jesus taught. But still, in the act of evangelizing our faith, there is the underpinning truth that we know something worth teaching to another, and that role of teacher creates in our minds a hierarchy in the faith. Some do not evangelize because they feel this hierarchy and consider themselves to unimportant or unqualified to bear the faith to others. This elevated position may not be our intention, but it becomes our reality. Never the less we cannot hide behind it. We are called to be one in Christ with our sisters and brothers which means we must somehow be equals not superiors. And yet we know that this tension exists. How do we share the "Good News" without assuming authority over the other person?

and grace. I say share because evangelism done well is a shared experience. Sharing does not mean dictating, it does not mean teaching, it does not mean saving. Sharing is about doing something or enjoying something together. We live into grace together. As Christians we have much we can learn from those outside the faith as we do life with them; just as they have much to learn from us. We must share our lives with others if we ever hope to be successful in sharing the Gospel! This means being vulnerable, it means listening, it means being open to others. Evangelism can feel like a big scary word, but doing life with others is not scary, it is rewarding and good. I encourage you to do life with others, build mutual trust, genuinely care for another, develop meaningful connections, and then share faith. Evangelism isn't truly about converting the nonbeliever, it is about transforming people, and we all need transformed by grace!






