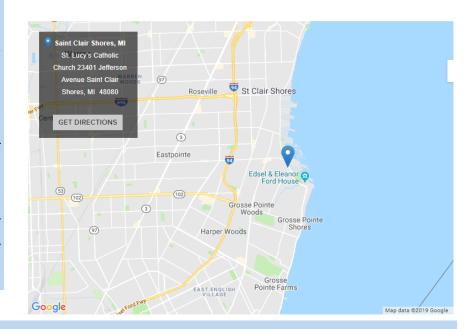

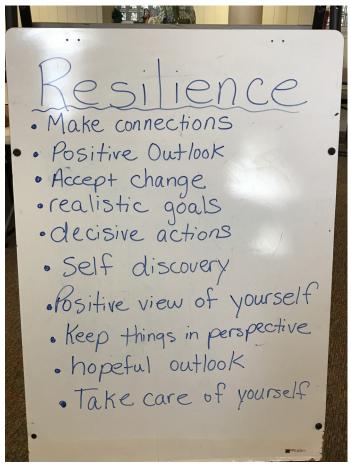

Dream It Be It program provided at Positive Images!

Using an outline from Soroptimist International of America (SIA), our club has now provided its **Dream It Be It** program to high school girls (thank you Amanda Be and Kerri Green!), middle school girls (two times!) and recently, to 15 women in recovery at Positive Images. This program is a hit no matter what the age of the participants or wherever it is presented.



Although many SIGP members helped support the sessions, mega kudos to Marya Malkovich Rosenthal and Ellen Chapin for continuing to adapt the SIA program to meet the needs of women who are in drug and alcohol rehab. Ellen says, "Everyone dreams of who they want to be and what they want their life to become. This program guides and supports their dreams."

Over the course of five two-hour sessions (held in July 2019), the women engaged in a series of activities, games, discussions and sharing to help them discover their dream and realize the tools needed to achieve it. Each session started with an ice breaker activity to present the theme of the day and each session ended with an activity to sum up what was learned.

On Day One the group set up the rules they wanted to follow during the sessions (see photo) and then each woman made a personal dream collage. Day Two was spent exploring their value systems and defining what values

were important to them. SMART goals were introduced and the women decided on their goals and the steps needed to achieve those goals and ultimately their dream.

Resilience, overcoming obstacles and coming back from failure were the topics of Day Three. On Day Four the women were exposed to different methods of dealing with stress. They participated in demonstrations of healthy eating (see photo on next page), yoga, exercise, meditation, music and crafts. The final day was spent learning to trust each other and themselves and to reach out for help when needed. Each woman received a journal and in them they wrote positive affirmations to each other.

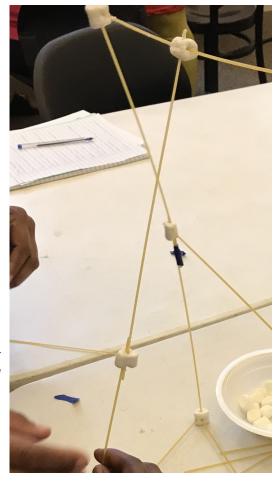
Everyone was sad to see the program come to an end, but the sessions were culminated by celebrating the women's success with pizza and ice cream sundaes.

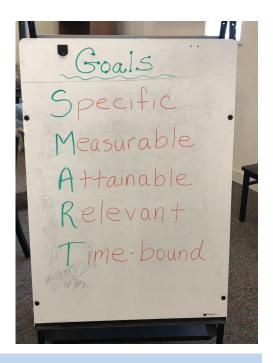
At right, the women work together on a competition. The goal is to build the tallest standing tower of spaghetti and marshmallows.

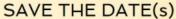
Positive Images Clothing Closet Gets a Facelift
