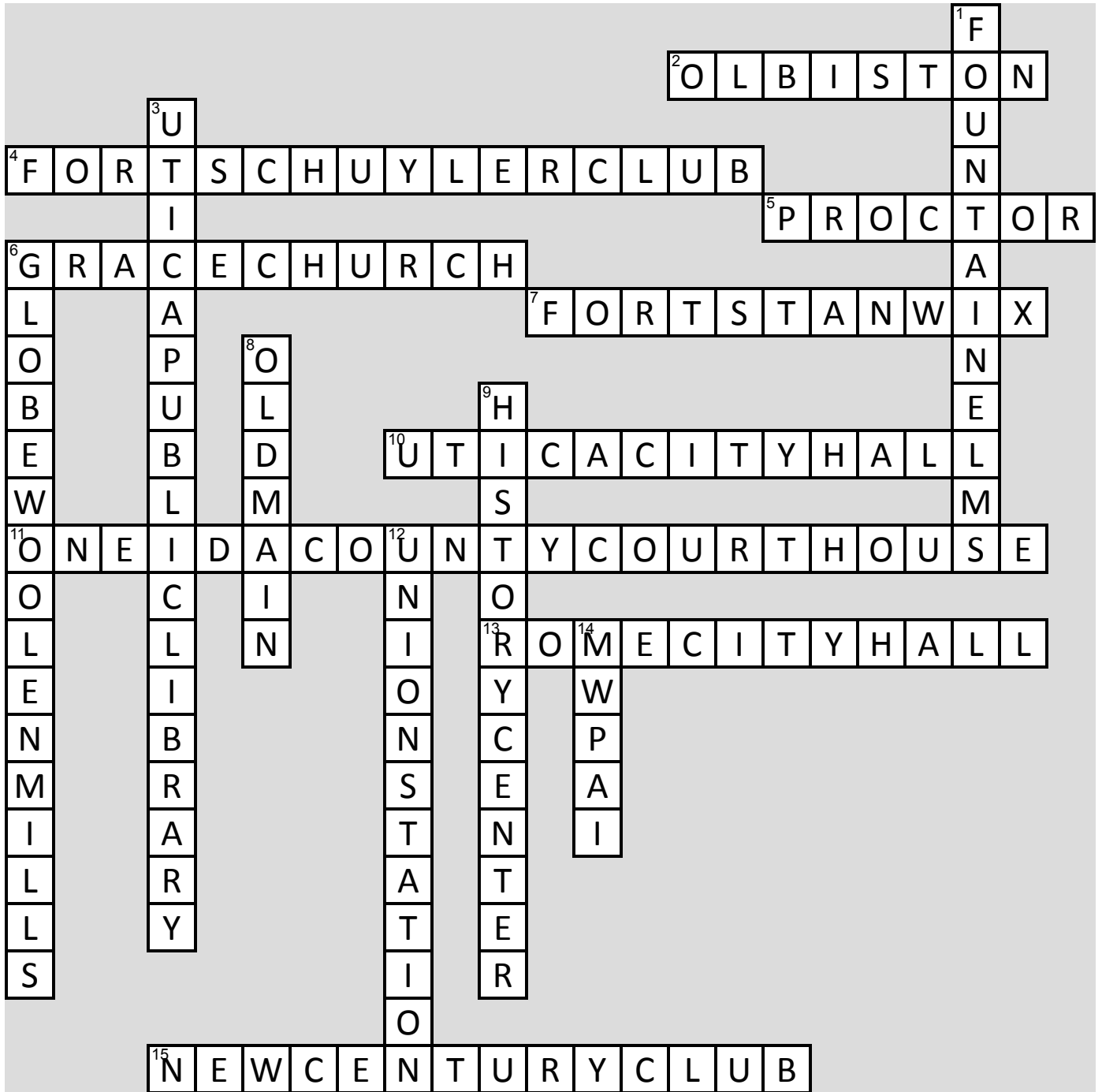


# Building Memories



## Across

- 2** This red sandstone building has housed multiple apartments since 1898.
- 4** A gentlemen's club in downtown Utica that had such esteemed members as Elihu Root, Francis Kernan and Horatio Seymour.
- 5** Educational institution, opened in 1936, was built partially by Works Progress Administration funds.
- 6** A religious building in downtown Utica that features a stone spire and Tiffany window.
- 7** Built in 1758 to guard a vital link between the Hudson River and Great Lakes.
- 10** Built in 1853, this civic building featured a bell tower and clock.
- 11** This Palladian-style building on Elizabeth St. has been the scene of many legal cases.
- 13** The civic center of Rome grew around this imposing building built in 1894.
- 15** Formerly a private residence in downtown Utica, it became headquarters for an organization promoting the moral and mental improvement of women.

## Down

- 1** This Tuscan villa once was the home of Frederick and Rachel Proctor.
- 3** The Proctors donated the land on which this building stands. Opening in 1904 it has served readers for over 100 years.
- 6** This complex manufactured fancy woolen goods, and helped Utica become a major source for textile production.
- 8** Dominated by a grand portico, this was the first hospital to serve patients with mental illness under the auspices of New York State. Affectionately known as...
- 9** Built in neo-classical revival style and once the First Church of Christ Scientist, this building now is home to the Oneida County...
- 12** Home of the NY Central Railroad, built in 1914, this building boasts its extensive use of marble.
- 14** Designed by Philip Johnson, this modern building has received many design awards. Abbr.
