

UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY

It's hurricane season and now is the time to start your preparations. The removal of debris from routine yard maintenance is vital this time of year. Take advantage of the city's regular trash collections to clear potentially dangerous debris and vegetation from your yard.


The time to cut back vegetation is before storms start brewing.

- Do all major cutting/tree removal as early as possible.
- If you are having trees removed or doing any other major cutting, be sure to have your contractor include the price of debris removal as part of their service. Debris from major cutting or tree removal will need to be transported to a yard waste processing facility; disposal fees may apply.
- Arrange to cut back all trees and weak branches that could contact buildings.
- Be sure to trim coconuts so they don't become dangerous missles during a storm.
- Have your foliage thinned so wind can flow freely through branches, decreasing the chance that trees and/ or plants will be uprooted.
- While you are trimming in anticipation of a storm, consider trimming back vegetation that obscures drivers' sight lines, hides traffic signs or obstructs pedestrian walkways or bike routes.

Use your green Yard Waste cart for weekly curbside collection on Thursdays. If you have more than will fit into your green cart, the city collects Bulk Trash in Lake Ridge on the 3rd Thursday of each month.

Place vegetation material from routine maintenance (up to 10 cubic yards – equivalent to 5 standard size refrigerators) at the swale on bulk collection day. Remember each piece cannot exceed 6 ft. in length.

Limited construction debris such as plywood, doors, cabinets, sinks and toilets can be picked up as part of the city's Bulk



Trash collection program. The Bulk Trash program does *not* accept vehicle batteries, dead animals, propane, fuels, oil or hazardous waste, tree stumps and paints.

(There are regularly scheduled Household Hazardous Waste Collection events during the year to dispose all unwanted paint, oils, chemicals and electronics. Once a Storm has been Named

Do not cut down trees or do major yard work.

Do not begin construction projects that produce debris.

Once a Storm Watch or Warning has been issued

Do not trim vegetation of any kind.

Do not take materials to the curb during a watch or warning period. Services may be suspended and facilities closed early to prepare for the storm.

Mass cutting places a tremendous burden on the collection and disposal processes and there isn't enough equipment or manpower to handle the additional material before the storm makes landfall. You could put not only yourself at risk, but your neighbors as well.





THE MAN BEHIND THE TREESAND HIS COHORTS

In September 2011 and September 2012, your Lake Ridge Civic Association submitted NCIP grant proposals to the City of Fort Lauderdale to plant mature native trees throughout our neighborhood. Our goal was to become an eco-friendly neighborhood by creating a majestic tree canopy throughout Lake Ridge. We wanted to attract new homeowners, reduce crime, and encourage neighbors to improve their own land-scaping. LRCA was awarded both grants.

Many of our residents have participated in a 4-year initiative to plant shade trees. A special thank you to former LRCA President Andrew Van Heyden who came up with the idea to plant native trees. LRCA is indebted to Andrew for his many years of service to our community and his fabulous idea. Another special thank you to Orlando Moreno, VP of LRCA for many years. Orlando wrote both grant proposals on behalf of LRCA. Thank you Orlando!

Many of you have seen Ruben Franco, our Tree Committee Chairperson, leading the tree planting charge. Planting began in Fall 2012 and continued through Fall 2015. To say that Ruben is passionate about trees is an understatement! Ruben embraced this initiative from the start. When you see Ruben, please thank him for what he has done for Lake Ridge.

In 2014, LRCA's current secretary, Erin Keenan, joined Ruben as Co-Chair. Erin has helped tremendously in extending the tree canopy to the east side of Lake Ridge by encouraging neighbors like Villa Medici and other apartment complexes to sign up for shade trees and agree to water and care for them.

None of this would be possible without the dedication and commitment of Gene Dempsey, the city's Urban Forester. Gene and Ruben Franco canvased the neighborhood multiple times identifying areas in need of shade trees.

Gene Dempsey is responsible for tree services and landscape installation throughout our city, including our Parks. When he is not running a "Tree Giveaway" Event for our residents, or teaching summer campers how to build a portable Wildlife

Habitat, he is leading a group of volunteers to eliminate invasive plants in our parks. Check out "Gene's Green Scene" blog on sustainability. Gene's passion for his work is contagious serving our city and its ecosystem for 20 years.

Five years ago, Gene Dempsey and Adrienne Ehle led the push to become a Community Wildlife Habitat. Becoming a Certified Community Wildlife Habitat helps strengthen the quality of our ecosystem, and gets us further towards other goals outlined in the City's Sustainability Action Plan. In April of this year, Fort Lauderdale was designated the 86th National Wildlife Federation Community Wildlife Habitat. While it truly "took a village" to meet this goal, we owe a debt of gratitude to Gene and Adrienne.

Gene has been a member of the Florida Forest Service, an Advisor on the Riverwalk Trust Sustainability Task Force, and he is currently the Vice President of the Florida Urban Forestry Council.

To quote Broward Chapter of the Florida Native Plant Society President, Richard Brownscombe "Gene has extensive knowledge about trees and plants and the heart to seek what needs to be done to serve the public and protect the environment."

Thank you Gene Dempsey for all you do for our city and for your help in enhancing Lake Ridge's urban forest.

STAY SAFE

When you think about Public Safety, you expect to hear advice like get to know your neighbors, don't post your travel plans on social media or don't leave items on your car seat that would entice someone to break your windows. Without detracting from those very important tips, I would like you turn your focus and think about your safety in terms of your health during the hot summer days ahead. Here a just a few scattered things for you to keep in mind. Enjoy your summer, but be safe!

- ♦ Stay hydrated, but don't over hydrate. Yes, it is possible to drink too much water. As with everything, moderation is key. The American College of Sports Medicine suggests drinking 16– 20 ounces of fluid one to two hours before an outdoor activity.
- ♦ Don't forget Sparky outside. Animals do not sweat like we do, but they can overheat just the same.
- Stay away from electrical appliances, electronics like TVs and computers, telephones, doors and windows during a lightning storm.
- Don't forget sunscreen with at minimum of 15SPF (I don't use anything below 35)
- Never use an outdoor grill indoors or in any space that isn't well-ventilated like a garage.
- ♦ Protect your eyes, wear sunglasses
- ◆ Do not leave children unattended near the pool, try using a buddy system
- ♦ Eliminate areas that support insect nests like stagnant pools of water
- ♦ Wear bug spray with DEET

There are lots of other issues of interest on the ballot this year

August 30th — Primary

Although it's called a primary election, many non-partisan races will be decided on August 30th. The non-partisan elections, including all county and circuit court judges, are open to all voters, regardless of party affiliation. If a nonpartisan candidate receives a majority of the votes on August 30th, they will be elected. (There may be run-off elections, if no candidate receives a majority of the votes.)

Depending on your party affiliation, there are partisan primaries for Broward County Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, Clerk of the Court, State's Attorney, state legislators, US House of Representatives, US Senator, and others. These are closed primaries — only registered party members may vote. There is still plenty of time to update your party affiliation. Winners of these contests move on to the general election in November

November 8th — General Election

Aside from the US Presidential contest, we'll be voting for Congress, state legislative positions and some county offices.

This year you will see proposals on the ballot to raise the Florida sales tax, which is currently 6%, The county and various municipalities have competing proposals on the ballot — both are asking to raise the tax to 7%.. The county will be asking for a transportation tax, primarily for transitrelated improvements. The cities will be asking for an infrastructure tax to fund capital improvements.

Candidate Forum

Once again, the Lake Ridge Civic Association will be teaming up with other nearby neighborhoods to host a Candidate Forum. Candidates for many local offices will join us on Thursday, August 4th at ArtServe. This gives you the opportunity to meet and question candidates prior to the August primary. Please check with our website LakeRidgeCivic.org for more details.. This has proved to be a popular and informative session in the past, and should be this year too.



REGISTER TO VOTE

If you haven't already registered to vote, there's still time to do so before the primary elections on August 30st (registration deadline August 1st) and the general election on November 8th (deadline October 11th).

You can register online, by mail or in person at the County Governmental Building 115 S. Andrews Avenue Room 102 (one block south of Broward Boulevard).




