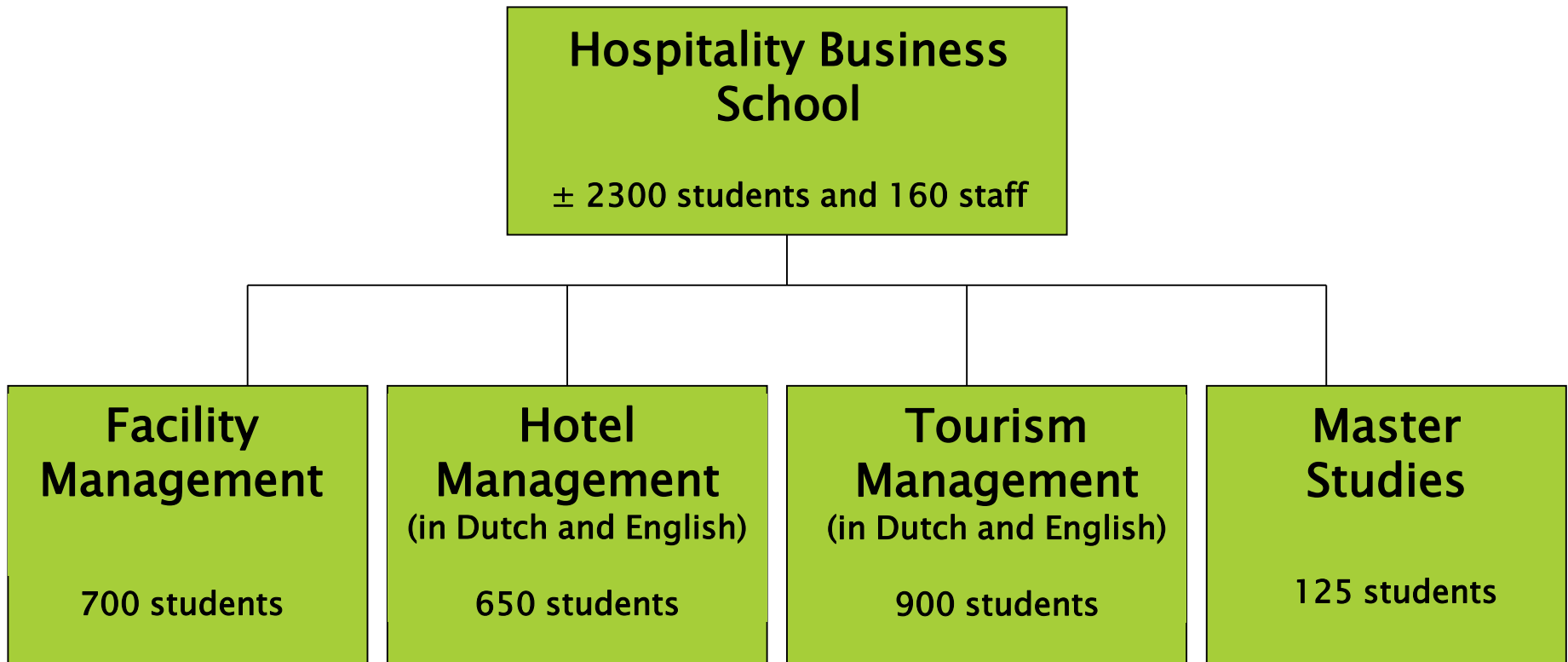

(EN15221-1: 2006 Facility Management – Part 1: Terms and definitions)

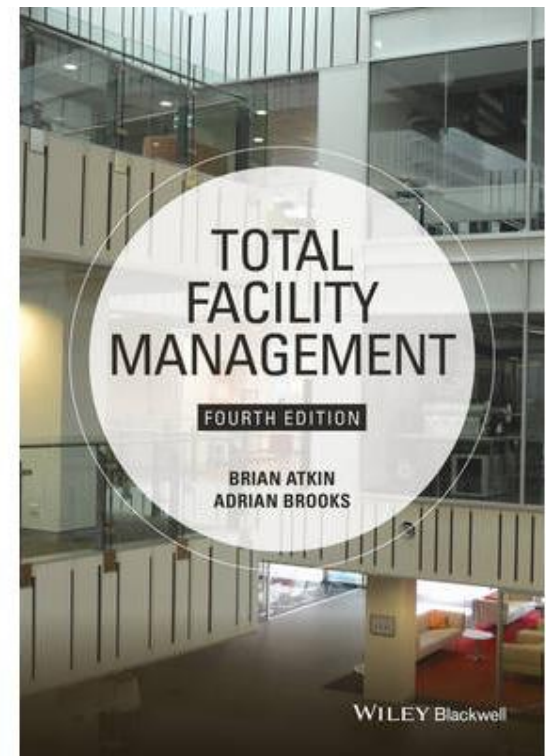
