### → From the Pastor →

But we do not want you to be uninformed, brethren, about those who are asleep, so that you will not grieve as do the rest who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who have fallen asleep in Jesus. For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore comfort one another with these words.



Truth. What brings you comfort? There are, of course, the "creature" comforts. For me that is sipping a hot cup of coffee in my favorite chair. Even when I was experiencing pain from my hips a few years ago, I could find comfort in that simple act. I didn't have to move unless the coffee got cold. I could watch TV, listen to soft music or read a book from that comfortable space. It was even better when I had Duncan, my orange and white cat, on my lap. For as long as I could stay there, I was comfortable; I was at peace. I could pray from that place, and focus on listening to God's response. There were no demands on my time, except if the dog wanted to go out. I could watch the birds out the window

and listen to their amazing concert of sounds. I could thank God for all creation.

Of course, we cannot always stay in our comfortable spaces. We have requirements that need to be met. We must do work, of some kind or another. We have those who need our attention. Our time in our comfortable space is often limited. Perhaps that is why we value it so much.

But, even when we are not in our comfortable space, or perhaps when we are in uncomfortable spaces, we can find another kind of comfort. That other kind of comfort comes from our faith. It is what we believe about our lives (that we have been called to follow Christ) and what we believe about our deaths(see the passage that begins this article). This is comfort of an entirely different type. It is not relegated to an article of furniture or a beverage. It is with us wherever we go. We can never be separated from it. It resides in our hearts when we think about those who have "fallen asleep in Jesus." As we age, the number of these beloved persons only increases. We think about them often. They are the saints who have gone on before us. It is those we will meet again, on the other side of the veil. It is those with whom we will spend eternity.

Comfort can be found in many places, many spaces. May your comfort be centered this day in our Lord Jesus Christ, who died and rose again so all who believe may spend eternity praising his holy name. Amen.


