Join the primary school-aged **students for lunch**, and meet with the school's headmistress to learn more about challenges the school faces as it strives to encourage academic success. Join the students for their **weekly student assembly** before riding the bus home with some of the students to see the villages where the children live.

Dinner will be at an Indian restaurant at the Impala Hotel where you will have a chance to chat with your fellow travelers about your exciting day! Return to the hotel for your overnight.

DAY 4 – Village Life

Today the group will travel to the **Usa River Village** to meet with local officials. Discuss the education, culture, and history of Tanzania as it relates to village life today.

After lunch at a local restaurant, visit the **Usa River Rehabilitation and Training Center**, an NGO that provides support to people living with disabilities. Learn about the training that takes place in vocations including carpentry, tailoring, shoemaking, locksmith, and metal work. Village officials will host a traditional Tanzanian barbeque this evening, complete with dancing and local musicians.

Enjoy a BBQ dinner this evening along with your **local staff and guides (and their families).**

DAY 5 – Explore Arusha

This morning, visit a local **Islamic School** and tour a local **mosque** in Arusha Town to experience prayer and dialogue about religious diversity and tolerance in Tanzania.

Enjoy lunch and explorations of the **Cultural Heritage Center**. The Cultural Heritage Center boasts beautiful ebony carvings and one of the largest selections of gemstones in Africa, including tanzanite—a rare, blue-violet stone found only in Tanzania. *Optional activities can be arranged such as drumming circle, dance class, music lesson.*

DAY 6 - Game Drive

En route, enjoy a game drive and picnic lunch at Lake Manyara National Park. Climb into an open-top, four-wheel-drive land cruiser for your wildlife viewing adventure. 400 species of birds, thousands of pink flamingos, hippos, elephants, giraffes, and the largest concentration of baboons in the world all call the national park home. You may even get to see local predators such as Lake Manyara's famous tree-climbing lions—during your three-hour excursion.

This afternoon, discover the tranquility of **Gibbs Farm**, established as a coffee farm in the late 1920s and later refurbished into a guesthouse. Upon arrival, you can expect to be greeted with the Swahili word *karibu*, an expression of genuine welcome as you settle in at your home for these next two days. Dinner is at the hotel tonight.

DAY 7 – Culture & Community

Spend the morning on a guided walking cultural tour of a traditional **Iraqw village in the Ngorongoro Highland Forests**. The Iraqw people settled in this area some two thousand years ago and speak a Cushitic language with its origins in Ethiopia. They are known for their unique houses that were built completely underground. You will have an opportunity to **tour an underground house** and learn about their way of life.

Afterwards, spend an hour touring **FAME**, a medical complex consisting of a medical dispensary, 21-bed hospital, and mobile medical clinic serving remote areas of the Tanzanian bush. You will learn about general medical practices in Tanzania; cultural challenges to providing patient/family-centered care; and collaborative work with local healers.

Return to Gibbs Farm for a savory lunch then meet with an **indigenous Maasai healer** who will lead a tour through the Ngorongoro Forest to learn about various plants and herbs used in Tanzania to treat health problems.

Dinner is provided this evening at your hotel.

OPTIONAL SAFARI EXTENSION POST-PROGRAM TRAVEL: TANZANIA

The **Ngorongoro Conservation Area (NCA)** was founded in 1959. It is the world's largest inactive volcanic caldera. It is unique in that it is the only conservation area in Tanzania that protects wildlife while allowing human habitants at the same time. An estimated 25,000 animals live inside the Ngorongoro Crater. The NCA is part of the Serengeti ecosystem.

DAY 1

Transfer to Ngorongoro Crater

Sightings of major game species within the NCA are hardly rare. During your tour, you may come across lions, elephants, hippopotamus, and rhinoceros. The NCA is the world's first multipurpose land use area that hosts tourism, research, conservation efforts, and allows local pastoralists access to ancestral grazing land while protecting valuable archaeological sites.

Once estimated to be a volcano towering 14,800 to 19,000 feet above sea level, the mountain violently exploded then collapsed on itself, forming a crater. Today the crater is 2,000-feet deep and covers 100 square miles. Though the crater walls aren't half their former height, they still sit more than a mile above sea level.

In the late afternoon you'll ascend on the eastern rim to the **Lion's Paw Camp** for a campfire, dinner, and overnight stay.

Note: Lion's Paw Camp is a semi-permanent tented camp. The tents feature flush toilets, running water, and 24-hour electricity.

DAY 2

Continue exploring as you transfer to the Serengeti

You'll experience one more crater tour for another chance to **watch big game moving around in the cool of the morning**. Increased predator activity and fewer tourist vehicles will leave you awed by the wild. But make sure you get rest the night before as you will be leaving the camp by 5:50 a.m. Head to the western rim by 11:00 a.m. and continue to central Serengeti for more game drives.

Before reaching the Serengeti, you will stop at Olduvai Gorge, site of Louis and Mary Leakey's famous archaeological discoveries. When the Leakeys found human tools in the 1930s, the evidence strongly suggested the earliest humans to walk the face of the Earth did so here in east Africa. As a result, we now know that Homo Sapiens occupied the site 17,000 years ago. After lunch, continue your travels then arrive at **Sametu Camp** in the late afternoon in time for showers, a campfire, and dinner to wrap up the day.

DAY

Explore the expanse of the Serengeti

The **Serengeti** is best known for its enormous herbivore migration, which is led by more than 1.4 million zebra and over 250 thousand wildebeest. Their presence makes the Serengeti a fantastic smorgasbord for predators looking to fill their bellies, so keep your eyes peeled for a possible hunt.

The Serengeti National Park is estimated to host about 70 types of large mammals and roughly 500 species of avifauna.

Spend the day **exploring the game park** with your guide and fellow travelers in small Jeeps. Make sure you have your camera handy!

Explore the expanse of the Serengeti

Soak in more wildlife sightings as you travel to the Seronera airstrip and fly back to Arusha, Tanzania, leaving late in the morning and arriving shortly after noon. Lunch will be provided this afternoon.

Head to the Kilimanjaro International Airport this afternoon to prepare for your flight home.


