Our guest speaker for the night was Jim Luikens of Berger Chevrolet fame. Instead of talking about his days working at the famous dealership, he talked about the Pontiacs he's owned.

His first Pontiac was a drag racer, a 1957 wagon that he ran rather successfully in many classes ranging from F/SA to N/SA.

His favorite Pontiac of all time was the 1969 Grand Prix SJ. Then he bought a light green 1969 GTO with the RAIV engine and an automatic transmission, 1 of 96 built. Also in the inventory was a 1970 GTO with the RAIV engine and a four speed, also (Pepper) green. Jim admitted to liking green cars.

After his days at Berger, he bought another 1969 Grand Prix SJ (in green of course). Then he and a friend bought two 1979 Tenth Anniversary Trans Ams. In the mid to late 70's, Jim bought the E/SA T-37 from Jerry Bachewski, 1 0f 11 built. Jim also owned two 1971 GTO Judges, an automatic in Quezel Gold, and a 4-speed in Canyon Copper.

The last two Pontiacs Jim owned were wagons, a 1972 LeMans in Sundance Orange, and then a 1978 full size.

We appreciate Jim for coming out and sharing with us his Pontiacs from the past.
