Border Patrol Agents, Mark Gerrish and Joseph Molnar, will be doing a follow up refresher on what border patrol agents do and what they have accomplished the past year.

Agent Mark Gerrish and I have both been with the United States Border Patrol for 10 years.

Mark Gerrish was an Acting Supervisor there and was a coordinator for criminal prosecution cases. He originally started his career with the Border Patrol in El Paso, Texas in 2009 and served there until 2016 when he transferred to Arizona. In Texas he was a member of the Anti-Terrorism Contraband Enforcement Team (ATCET) which was an operation targeted at the Ports of Entry to disrupt and dismantle narcotics and weapons smuggling organizations.

I have been with the Tucson Station my entire career and have participated in several details ranging from the Tactical Infrastructure team to the Silverbell Initiative, a special operation targeted with interdicting narcotics and illegal smuggling in Avra Valley area. We have both been members of the Tucson Coordination Center (TCC) which is the detention center where all individuals that are apprehended in the Tucson Sector are detained and processed. Together Agent Gerrish and I bring a wide range of law enforcement experience and I hope we can help your club understand the Border Patrols mission here in Arizona and at large.
