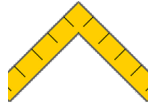

July is the month in which Americans celebrate their independence from Britain by commemorating the July 4<sup>th</sup>, 1776 signing of the Declaration of Independence. The 'Fourth of July', as the holiday is commonly known, is one of the most popular American holidays on the calendar, with fireworks displays and festive barbecues marking the occasion in communities all over the country. Interestingly the now well-known date of July 4 was not at first universally accepted as the correct day to memorialize. In a letter to his wife Abigail, John Adams famously expected that July 2<sup>nd</sup>, the date on which it was decided indeed that the colonies would declare their independence from the British monarch, would be the day celebrated by future generations. The document that would be commissioned on that day, would be signed two days later on the 4<sup>th</sup> by most, by not all, of the colonies. It wasn't until July 9 that New York would become the last to sign the Declaration of Independence and the colonies were officially united as states.

The following year in 1777, no discussion of commemorating the event would even occur until July 3<sup>rd</sup>, too late to celebrate the 2<sup>nd</sup>, and so the 4<sup>th</sup> was chosen instead and hence the tradition was born.

Ultimately it's not the date or even the signing of the Declaration of Independence that we are moved to celebrate but our independence itself and the very ideas contained in that historic document; ideas that have since become the foundation of human rights the whole world over. Soon after our success, a revolution would topple the French monarchy and start a wave of reform through Europe and the world that continues today.

However we celebrate the holiday, whether with great spectacle or with reserved reflection, we are celebrating not just the birth of a nation, our nation, but the dawn of an era of enlightenment and a ringing of freedom and hope for all of humanity.
