Feather Lake is a stormwater-detention basin the El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon Society leases from the City of El Paso and manages as a wildlife sanctuary and environmental education area. It occupies 43.5 acres, including a 40-acre wetland. The City excavated the original Feather Lake basin in 1969. It deepened and expanded the basin to its present size in 1986-87. In the process, much of the existing plant cover was removed. In the years since, Audubon has worked to establish native riparian vegetation around the margins of the basin and native desertscrub vegetation in the uplands. Today, Feather Lake's wetland, riparian and upland habitats support a diverse mix of birds and other wildlife and provide visitors a glimpse of river-valley ecosystems that have largely disappeared from this region.
