We all know St. Theresa the Little Flower (feast day Oct. 1) but not much about her parents who were Louis Martin and Zelie

Geurin--feast day Sept. 25). Their sainthood derived from their ordinary life roles and as parents that lead them to sainthood. Both Louis and Zélie Guérin, had been disappointed in attempts to enter religious life. They married in 1858, and were blessed with nine children. She died from breast cancer in 1877. His health began to fail after his 15-year-old daughter entered the Monastery of Mount Carmel at Lisieux in 1888 dving in 1894. The home that Louis and Zélie created nurtured the sanctity of all their children, but especially their youngest, who is known to us as Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus. In life, Louis and Zélie knew great joy and excruciating sorrow. They firmly believed that God was with them throughout every challenge that married life, parenting, and



LITURGY UPDATES ♦ MASS TIME

CHANGE: Beginning this week the Wednesday Mass time will change to 5:30 pm and another Mass will be added on Thursdays at 12:05 pm.

CONFESSIONS: Will be heard in the parish center beginning Monday. Masks must be worn at all times. You will enter the parish center and go down the classroom hallway. Chairs will be positioned at least six feet apart down the hall. A sanitizer station including masks will be provided opposite these chairs. The last classroom will have two chairs and a screen set up in it for the sacrament. Parishioners will then exit out the door at the end of the hallway so as to avoid cross traffic.





From the Pastor

An Enormous "Thank You!" – But Not A Farewell! As many of you know, Kathleen Wadkins has been working at St. Mary Star of the Sea for over 16 years. This week, she will retire from her current job as Pastoral Assistant for Administration. Kathleen has been an invaluable asset to this parish over the years. With the increase in complexity of the management of parishes combined with the fact that some priests have little or no administrative skills or experience, Kathleen has been the person who has done much of the work of running the parish's temporal matters. In the absence of Fr. Peter, Kathleen was given the temporary responsibility to coordinate all aspects of the parish and was assigned as a lay Pastoral Coordinator until a priest was assigned. So, on behalf of the Archdiocese, and all of you I say, Thank you so much Kathleen!

May the Lord bless you abundantly for your good work. On a side note, some parishioners have asked why we need this and other paid positions in the church. The answer is really quite simple. It used to be the case that the church had many more volunteers (but people's lives have become much more complex with many more demands) and it also had more vocations of both men and women religious (this has dropped proportionally with the smaller families people are having – and a little due to other factors). Add to this that over the years church management has become more complex (due to ever increasing regulations and expectations). So, we are very much in need of the church employees we have. I can assure you they work many more hours than what they are paid for and work for significantly less than what they would be paid in comparable secular jobs! So a big thank you to all our employees!

HOW TO ATTEND MASS AND ADORATION AT ST. MARY STAR OF THE SEA

Mass times – The weekend Masses will be held:

- Saturday Masses 4:00 pm in English and 5:30 pm in English.
- Sunday Masses 8:30 am in Spanish and 11:00 am in English.
- Weekday Masses 12:05 pm during the week Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament 12:30 to 4:00 pm Fridays with a designated greeter/facilitator.
- You must make a reservation.
- Register for Masses, Adoration and other religious services: 360-385-3700 or at kwadkins@stmaryss.com. Arrive 15-30 minutes before Mass to check-in.
- Enter the double doors nearest the rectory.
- Self check for COVID19 symptoms.
- Greeters will check-in Mass attendees, who will be directed to seats by an usher.
- Greeters have discretion to inquire about your health and to turn you away if you appear ill. For example, feverish or coughing.
- Everyone is required to wear a face mask. If you do not have a mask, one will be given to you. There will be sanitation stations near the entrance equipped with hand sanitizer and masks for those who need them.
- Social distancing of at least 6 feet is required while on church property. Follow tape marks and signs.
- Put donations in the collection box at the back of the church.
- Exiting the church.
- After Mass exit through the side door on Mary's side of the church.
- Go directly to your vehicle and do not stop to visit.
- Maintain social distancing.

Volunteers will be cleaning and sanitizing the church before and after every Mass and Communion Service. Your help would be most welcome! Please call the Parish Office to volunteer.

If you have questions, concerns, or want some things clarified, please contact the Parish Office, a Parish Council member, or a Ministry leader. We are in this together, and with God's grace we will persevere and thrive.
