

Modeling Project

As I announced at the September meeting, this year's Modeling Project is "Making Natural Trees". This year we are trying something that will hopefully help you make better scenery on your home layouts. You will get the opportunity to make a mini-diorama and include on it the natural trees that you make from the supplied materials and natural materials of your own choosing.

Rules for the Project are being posted on the SCWD website under "Contests", then see "Modeling Project". Rules for the project are that you must be an NMRA member, must make trees using natural materials as part of the scenery of a minidiorama that is no larger than 160 x 160 scale feet in size. For HO scale this space is approximately 2 square feet and for N scale it is one square foot. The mini-diorama has to include railroad track of the appropriate scale. The mini-diorama may also include structures, vehicles, figures, other scenery items (shrubs, turf, grass, etc.), etc. as you prefer, but may not include any trees not made of natural materials.

A \$10 deposit is required for you to receive your natural tree materials at the November SCWD meeting. The deposit will be refunded if you bring the finished mini-diorama for entry into our popular vote contest at the April 2024 SCWD meeting. We will be offering 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prizes separately for the N and HO categories again this year.

Note, to those who have been virtually attending SCWD meeting, you can participate in this project as well. Simply contact Mike Vivion not later than October 30, 2023, via email or phone to work out the details. Mike's contact information is in the SCWD Red Book.

On our Webpage at the end of the Model Project section, there are some links to several You Tube videos, showing how to make the trees. Also, we are tentatively planning to present a clinic on this subject at the April 2024 SCWD meeting.

As I am writing this column, we have 11 people signed up for the Modeling Project, and I hope we will get as many, or more, to sign up at the October SCWD meeting. Remember your last chance to sign up is at the October meeting or by contacting me directly before October 30th.

Based on the responses I heard at the September meeting, I think this year's Project will be one we will all enjoy.

Most of which will be used next month for the soldering class in October.









The class went well, and hopefully they can use these skills to help maintain a smooth running layout. Last but not least I want to give a BIG THANK YOU TO CHRIS AND BILL. Bill had done a lot of leg work and research on prices for the tools that were used. You guys are great!

A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's



layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with 3 introductory puzzles to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.


The listserv is a one-way email broadcast to you, not a social media type service. The emails are sent in bulk, but as a BCC: type email.


OPS Puzzles

Attendance was approximately 90 people.

Total cost of picnic was \$1,631.

\$5.00 fee collected from all who signed up—about 100—several were unable to attend. Several other members gave donations over and above to the \$5.00 fee to help cover the cost of Youth Group members.

Hy-Vee catered the picnic. There were too many buns, but enough pulled pork, brats, hamburgers, and condiments.

Next year more lemonade will be provided.

Received a donation of \$200.00 to help cover the cost of the picnic from the National Model Railroad Association which is the maximum available to NMRA Divisions that sponsor activities that promote and encourage membership.




