
#### **Features**

Features include a Memorial Park with beautiful plantings and a walkway paved with inscribed memorial bricks from donors to honor and thank those who made a difference in our lives and whose names are forever etched in recognition. Armed Services insignias will be engraved in granite monuments formed in the shape of our state.

The carillon bells will offer an unforgettable experience of inspiring sounds, helping to make this site a desirable and attractive landmark destination.







**The Tower's** first floor Education Center features room for exhibitions and programming space with state of the art projection and sound equipment. Exhibits will recognize veterans, focus on community service, and inspire future generations to serve. It will accommodate 30 - 55 people for classes, receptions, ceremonies and more.






#### The Community Memorial Park

will be landscaped with floral plantings and year-round foliage. Walkways with engraved memorial bricks and benches will lead to a five-pedal memorial garden honoring each of the branches of the military. Decorative lighting will enhance the Bell Tower structure while illuminating the flag court consisting of Stars and Stripes, State of Wisconsin and POW/MIA flags. Two granite monuments with special lighting will greet you as you enter the park.

**Carillon by Verdin** is a state of the art system that reproduces the sound of cast bronze tower bells and offers a wide repertoire of music, whether patriotic, solemn for memorial services, or festive for happy times. The carillon will set the tone for every occasion and make this a desirable and attractive landmark destination.





#### Why give now?

The land has been acquired from the City of Pewaukee and an agreement is signed with the Verdin company for a carillon bell system to be installed in the Bell Tower Memorial once built. Construction documents are moving forward and working committees are being expanded. Your support ensures this project will be fully realized, carrying out our mission to **Honor, Educate and Remember**.




### Remember our past to shape our future

Stories of the national conflicts and local history of Pewaukee and SE Wisconsin need to be preserved and retold to keep our history alive. Sharing these memories and their impact also strengthens connections across generations. The Bell Tower Memorial encourages all visitors to contemplate the past - and apply its lessons to the future.

#### **Enhanced Phase 1 - Bell Tower Memorial Park:**

The goal is to complete items needed for final engineering work. This includes: site preparation, installation of rain gardens, parking lot and lighting, grass and initial landscaping, footings and foundation for the tower, walkways including memorial bricks, two engraved granite monuments, and three-flag court with special lighting. **Funding Needed: \$400,000** 



#### **Veterans Oral History Project**

Educating the community is at the forefront of the Bell Tower Memorial's continuing mission. During the spring of 2017, BTM partnered with St. John's Northwestern Military Academy, Pewaukee High School and Waukesha West High School students to create a Veterans Oral History Project (VOHP). The VOHP paired high school students with local veterans to document the many stories these men and women have to tell. The live interviews were recorded and submitted to the Library of Congress as part of a national oral history project. The project culminated with an honorary ceremony and luncheon held on May 21, 2017.




