DUFRESNE, JR., a Notary Public, in and for this Parish and Stabe personally came and appeared the several parties, all of the full age of majority and confidence of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, whose signatures are subscribed, who declared, in the pursone of the undersigned competent witnesses that, availing themselves of the provisions of Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950-L.R.S. 12:101-12:155, they do hereby organize a non-profit corporation as defined in L.R. S. 12:101, (3) under and in accordance with these articles of incorporation:

ARTICLE I -- HAME

The name of this corporation is "K-T-H Volumbeer Pire Department" and is to be a non-profit organization as defined by L. R. S. 12:181 (8).

ARTICLE II --PURPOSES

This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following:

To promote, train and teach interest. Members entitled to such certificates are those who are in good standing actively enrolled and participating in the program of the corporation, and their dues being paid for the current year and their names enrolled on the official roster.

Each holder of a certificate of membership shall be entitled to one (1) vote. Certificate of membership shall not be transferable either by assignment, sale or inheritance.

Any person who is interested in the objects for which this corporation is organized may become a member upon application and upon the pagment of dues as hereinafter provided.

ARTICLE VII -- OFFICERS

The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Fire Chief, Captain, First Lieutenant, Sergeant At Arms and Parliamentarian.

These officers shall be elected from the entire membership annually. The first officers shall be as follows:

ARTICLE VIII -- KERTHUS

There shall be at least three meetings per month of the corporation. The first meeting of the month will be devoted to the training of firemen. The second meeting of the month shall be an executive board meeting. The third meeting of the month will be devoted to the business of the corporation.

ARTICLE IN -- DY-LAMS

The members shall have the power to make, amend and repeal bylaws to govern this corpulation provided they are in accordance with and do not conflict with these articles.

AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF K-T-H VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

PERSONALLY CAME AND APPEARED:

MERVIN P. AUTIN, President, and THOMAS TAMPLAIN, JR., Secretary of, and acting for, K-T-H Volunteer Fire Department, a non-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Louisiana, who did declare that pursuant to a resolution of a special meeting of the members of this non-profit corporation passed and adopted by two-thirds of the members present at said special meeting after the notice required by law of said special meeting had been given, they now appear for the purposes of effecting amendments to the Articles of Incorporation, so as to make the following articles read as follows, ro-wit:

APTICLE 1 - NAME

The name of this corporation is 'HAHNVILLE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, INC." and is to be a non-profit organization as defined by L. R. S. 12:201(7).

ARTICLE VII - OFFICERS

The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Fire Chief, Assistant Fire Chief, Captain, First Lieutenant, Sergeant at arms, and Parliamentarian. This corporation shall have the authority to create the office of Second Lieutenant by a two-thirds vote of the members at any regular or special meeting, with prior notice given to the members.

ARTICLE XII - INDEMNIFICATION (NEW)

This corporation shall indemnify and hold harmless each director and officer now or hereafter serving the corporation from and against any and all claims and liabilities to which he may be or become subject by reason of his now or hereafter being or having heretofore been a director or officer of the corporation and or reason of his alleged acts or omissions as such director or officer, whether or not he continues to be such officer or director at the time when any such claim or liability is asserted and shall reimburse each such director and officer for all legal and other expenses reasonably incurred by him in connection with defending any or all such claims or liabilities, including amounts paid or agreed to be paid in connection with reasonable settlements made before final adjudication with the approval of the Board of Directors whether or not he continues to be such director of officer at the time such expenses are incurred provided, however, that no director or officer shall be indemnified against any claim or liability arising out of his own bad faith, reckless disregard of his duties, gross negligence or willful midconduct or shall be indemnified against or reimbursed for and expense incurred in defending any or all such claims or liability or in settling the same unless in the judgment of the Directors of this corporation, that director or officer against whom such claims or liability is asserted has the second not been guilty of bad faith, reckless disregard of his duties, gross The foregoing right of indemnification negligence or willful misconduct. 网络生物生物 医多流性 经收益 shall not be exclusive of other rights to which any director or officer 1. 64 9 Ed. 50 C. 1881 may be entitled as a matter of law. Except as hereinabove limited, directors and officers shall be entitled to all protection that can legally be afforded them under R, S. 12:201, and any other rights to which they may be entitled as a matter of law.

ARTICLE XIII - DISSOLUTION (NEW)

Notwithstanding anything hereinabove contained in the event of the dissolution or final liquidation of this corporation any surplus, in excess of the corporation's outstanding liabilities shall be promptly transferred and delivered to any non-profit corporation, provided that it then has tax exemption under existing United States Internal Revenue Codes and Regulations, as may be designated by the Board of Directors of this corporation.

ARTICLE XIV - TAX EXEMPT STATUS (NEW)

Notwithstanding the enumeration of powers specified in these Articles of Incorporation, nothing shall be construed as empowering this corporation to engage in activities which in themselves are not in furtherance of religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in effect or hereafter amended.

ARTICLE XV - MEMBERS LIABILITY (NEW)

No member of this corporation shall ever be held liable or responsible for contracts, debts of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid dues, if any, owing by him or her to the corporation, nor shall any meer informality in organization have the effect of rendering these Articles of incorporation null or of exposing the members to any liability other than as above provided.

PERSONALLY CAME AND APPEARED: Dennis Robbins & Thomas W. Tamplain, Jr., herein appearing and acting for Hahnville Volunteer Fire Department, Inc., by act before Edward A. Dufresne, Jr., Notary Public, formerly known as K-T-H Volunteer Fire Department, dated August 2, 1967, recorded in Charter Book 8, folio 40, St. Charles Parish, Louisiana, and recorded August 7, 1967, in the Record of Non-Trading Corporations Book 37, Secretary of State records, by amendment of Articles of Incorporation by act before Charles C. Wilson, duly recorded in Ch. book 15, folio 192, of the records of the Parish of St. Charles, domiciled and having its principal place of business in the Parish of St. Charles, who declared that pursuant to the resolution of the members of the corporation, adopted at a regular meeting of the members of the corporation, held September 4, 1996, a certified copy of the minutes of which said meeting is hereunto annexed and made a part hereof, they now appear for the purpose of executing this act of amendment and putting into authentic form the amendments so agreed to by the unanimous vote of all the members of said corporation present.

And said appearers further declared that by said unanimous vote of all of the members of said corporation, it was resolved that the Articles be amended as follows:

Articles II is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE 11 - PURPOSES

This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following:

To promote, train and teach interested parties in the preservation and protection of life and property from destruction by fire or other catastrophe, to own, purchase, lease, donate, rent, hire, mortgage, sell, transfer or assign real or movable property necessary and pertinent in the operation of a Volunteer Fire Department, and to provide fire prevention and fire protection for Fire District Number III of St. Charles Parish of the State of Louisiana and may assist in other emergency situations in the surrounding vicinity.

Article VI is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VI - BASIS OF ORGANIZATION

This corporation shall be organized without capital stock and membership shall be evidenced by certificate of membership.

Members entitled to such certificates are those who are in good standing, actively enrolled and participating in the program of the corporation, and their dues being paid for the current year and their names enrolled on the official roster. Certificates of membership shall not be transferable either by assignment, sale or inheritance.

Any person who is interested in the objects for which this corporation is organized may become a member upon application and fulfillment of membership requirements as indicated by the By-Laws.

Voting members are entitled to one (1) vote and are defined by the Constitution and By-Laws.

Article VII is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII - OFFICERS

The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Fire Chief. Any additional positions or responsibilities of the department may be created as needed in accordance with the By-Laws. Article VIII is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Meetings shall be provided for in the By-Laws.

Article XI is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE XI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The business and affairs of this corporation shall be managed and all corporate powers thereof shall be vested in and exercised by a board, with a minimum of seven (7) members.

The directors of this corporation shall consist of the president and chief with the remaining members being elected by the membership. No more than two (2) assistants to the chief and two (2) additional business officers can be elected to the board. Additional directors may be added by a 2/3 majority vote of the general membership as specified by the By-Laws.

Article XIII is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE XIII - DISSOLUTION

Notwithstanding anything hereinabove contained in the event of the dissolution or final liquidation of this corporation any surplus, in excess of the corporation's outstanding liabilities shall be promptly transferred and delivered to the St. Charles Inc., Firemen's Association/and/or any non-profit corporation, provided that it then has tax exemption under existing United States Internal Revenue Codes and Regulations, as may be designated by the Board of Directors of this corporation.

And said appearer having requested me, Notary, to note said amendments in authentic form, I do by these presents receive said amendments in the form of this public act to the end that they may be promulgated and recorded as hereinabove set forth.
