2017 Board of Directors and New Officers – TBLA has a new Board of Directors and new officers as a result of last month's annual meeting. We need to give a big thanks to John Toliver, outgoing President of TBLA. John has served as President of TBLA for the past 4 years. John served the maximum two terms as President allowed by TBLA's by-laws and he is now passing the torch to new President Gary Moore. Please join me in congratulating and thanking John for his successful tenure. John will be the first to tell you that he could not take personal credit for most of the good things that have happened to TBLA and the Toledo Bend community, but he should not deny that his leadership was invaluable to the organization in these past two years.

As John departs his office, TBLA has nearly 500 memberships, and 1000 members and we have seen the lake designated by Bassmaster's Magazine as the #1 Bass Lake in the country for an unprecedented two consecutive years. TBLA's Lunker Bass Program was a significant factor in this designation, and John was front and center representing TBLA, the lake, and pushing positive publicity and discussions whenever possible to help tell the Toledo Bend story. John's communication efforts had a lot to do with Toledo Bend's selection as the Number One Bass Lake. Under John's watch, TBLA also took an active role in growing future fisherman for the Lake by sponsoring local High School fishing teams in Sabine parish and Sabine County. We are financially in good health, despite the difficult economic circumstances of the past 24 months in our local area, and well positioned to continue the mission of TBLA for the future. John did a great job of leading the organization, so please thank him when you get a chance.

At last month's annual membership meeting, a new slate of TBLA Board of Directors was elected and a new slate of officers was elected by the new Board at the October 18th board meeting. Kathy Little and Dana Yeldell's 3-year terms ended and they did not run for re-election. Please thank Kathy and Dana for their tireless service on the Board. They were always offering great ideas and insight to the board as we worked to move TBLA forward. Bill Galligan and John Toliver's terms expired and they were re-elected to the board. John chose to fill the remaining one year term vacated by Scotty Lucas, who resigned from the board, one year short of his full 3-year term. We are pleased to welcome the following new board members who were elected to 3-year terms: Bruce Rogers, Eddie Pastureau, and Ricky Yeldell.

The new TBLA Board of Directors met on October the 18th and elected the following officers for the next 12 months: Bill Galligan re-elected as secretary, Gaynell Goodeaux re-elected as treasurer, Rhonda Dean re-elected as second vice president, Ted Dove elected as first vice president, and Gary Moore elected as president.

Additionally, Board member Russel Wheeler submitted his resignation to the board, due to relocation. Because Russell's resignation was received after the October election, the board nominated and elected a replacement to fill the remaining year of his 3-year term. Russell was the
