This is in response to your requests for a fee waiver in connection with your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for Science Files Underlying EPA Administrator's Greenhouse Gas ("GHG") Endangerment and Cause or Contribute Findings.

We have reviewed your fee waiver justifications and based on the information provided, we are denying your requests for a fee waiver. You have not expressed a specific intent to disseminate the information to the general public. As a result of you failing to meet the above criteria, accordingly, there is no need to address the remaining prongs of the fee waiver criteria. You may have received a letter dated March 27, 2014 that said the Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response will be responding to your information request, but that was done in error. The Office of Air and Radiation (OAR) will be responding to your request for information on behalf of the Agency.

Under the FOIA, you have the right to appeal this fee waiver denial determination to the National Freedom of Information Office, U.S. EPA, FOIA and Privacy Branch, 1200 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. (2822T), Washington, D.C. 20460 (U.S. Postal Service only), or E-mail: hq.foia@epa.gov. Only items mailed through the United States Postal Service may delivered to 1200 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW. If you are submitting your appeal via hand delivery, courier service or overnight delivery, you must address your correspondence to 1301 Constitution Avenue, N.W., Room 6416J, Washington, DC 20004. Your appeal must be made in writing, and it must be submitted no later than 30 calendar days from the date of this letter. The Agency will not consider appeals received after the 30 calendar day limit. The appeal letter should include the request numbers listed above. For quickest possible handling, the appeal letter and its envelope should be marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

Should you choose to appeal this determination, please be sure to fully address all factors required by EPA's FOIA Regulations, located at 40 C.F.R. § 2.107(l) in your appeal. If you have any questions concerning this determination please contact me at (202) 566-1667.
