



Did you know ...

- Mental illness is the term for a group of disorders causing severe disturbances in thinking, feeling, and relating, which result in substantially diminished capacity for coping with the ordinary demands of life.
- Mental illness in a family is nothing to be ashamed of. Mental illness can affect persons of any age and can occur in any family, regardless of race, gender, wealth, or social status. Approximately 1 in 5 adults in the U.S. – 43.8 million or 18.5% – experiences mental illness in a given year.
- Nearly 1 in 25 (10 million) adults in America live with a serious mental illness. Half of all chronic mental illnesses begin by age 14; three quarters by age 24. Despite effective treatment, there can be long delays between the onset of symptoms and when people get help, if at all.
- Persons with mental illness have a neurobiological disease. Those with mental illnesses are usually of normal or high intelligence, however their illnesses create difficulty performing at a normal level.

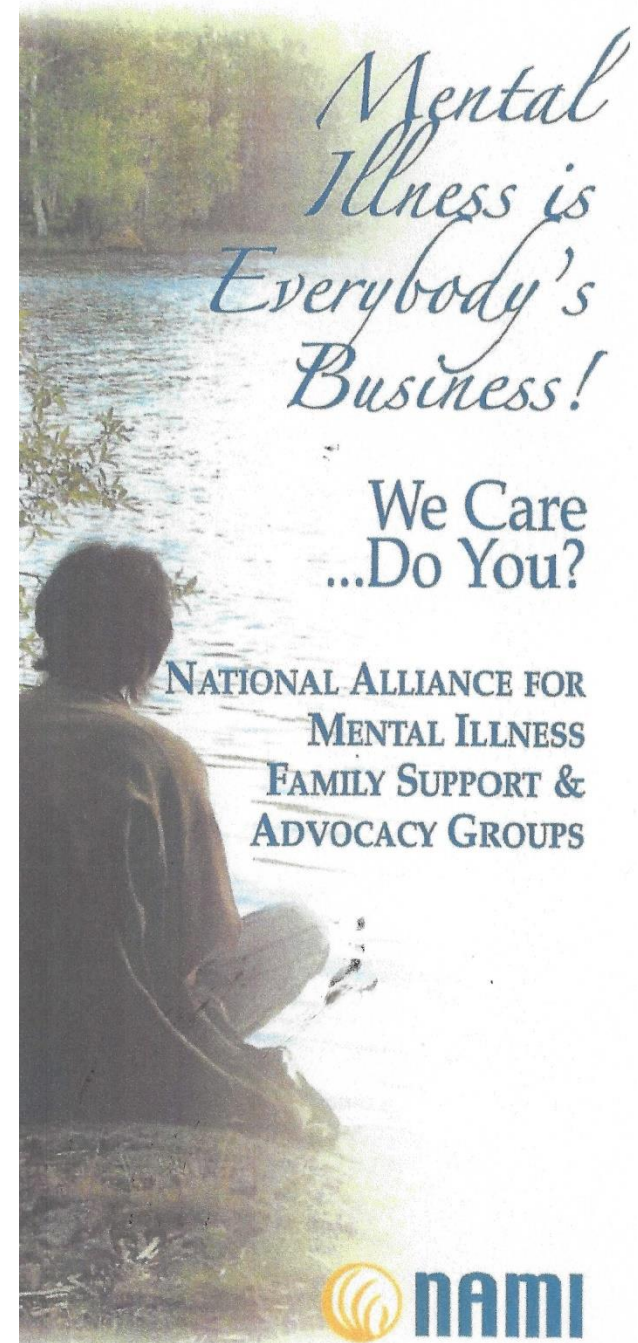

How to Help

Help combat stigma by objecting to negative stereotypes of mentally ill persons. Tactfully correct misunderstandings about mental illness by friends, relatives, and media.

If you are an employer, hire these persons for low stress jobs. There can be tax advantages for hiring such employees.

As a taxpayer, support finding a good community-based support system.

If you are a homeowner, welcome group homes in your neighborhood. People with mental illnesses can be good neighbors.

Groups can help finance a home or apartment for mentally ill persons, support a drop-in center (a social and educational club) and vocational training.

If you or a family member has a mental illness, or you are a caregiver, join your local NAMI chapter.

Spread the word so that other families will know about NAMI and how to get help.
