- James Clark Toy Run Final Report: Not Ready Yet Sold 87 More Toy Run T-Shirts at Myers Duren. James showed pictures of the 40th Anniversary Toy Run Shirt to the Group with a lot of favorable comments and groans of appreciation.

- Art State Board Report & Legislative Report: Not Here Tonight
- Roger Share the Road Report: Roger is begging us for help April 10th and 11th at the Trucking
 Association Truck Rodeo in Oklahoma City, OK. Set up cones, hand out water to the help and tell our
 STR story to those who will listen. Also, good grounds for foraging for new members as well. (918)
 606-4498 is his Text #. James Clark will put out a Robo Call reminder for this event.
- Downed Bikers Report: No one in attendance!
- Rob Safety Presentation: Discussed to the need to have TPS monitors in our Bike Tires. He
 mentioned we should perhaps lobby for a Bill stating these should be a law that they be included in
 all new motorcycle sales. Only some BMW's and Harley CVO's come standard with them today, so it
 can be done, and is not all that costly. Can be purchased on the aftermarket if you wish to, but may
 run on an App in your phone and not be integral to your bike as we would like them to be.
- Road Captain Before the meeting, the Board moved to appoint Scott Bunch as the new Road
 Captain for 2-years beginning March 28th 2019. May be possible to combine forces with Rt. 66 HOG
 and do a combined Sunday Breakfast with a Ride afterwards. Scott Bunch to investigate if possible.

Old Business:

- Reminder that the Bylaws are on our Website for another month for review prior to us taking a final vote to ratify them.
- Continue discussion surrounding potential new meeting space. We lost the meeting space that James Clark found, because another person acted on the space before we could. The question now is, how many of you are in favor of leaving the meeting space here at Mazzio's where all we need to do is show up and there is food, drinks and a meeting space provided for free, and would prefer to seek out our own meeting space which most likely will need to either have food prepared by grilling outside, or ordering in food in advance so it arrives for our 7:00PM meeting time. Food would still be paid for by those ordering it, and the rent on a building could run between \$300 to \$500 per month plus Insurance costs. We would almost assuredly need to lease chairs for a total of \$5 from Cheryl's Church, until we could buy them, and purchase tables so you all have a place to eat on and write on at the meetings. Let's hold a 10-minute discussion and then vote if we want to continue seeking out spaces to rent for our own meeting space or if we wish to remain as is at Mazzio's and save our money for other Legislative or Safety related things. 10 minutes of discussion was held. A paper ballot was taken at the end of the 10 minutes and the vote was 13 members voting for renting the space near 41st and Memorial for between \$300 and \$500 plus Insurance per month, if we can get it back, and 7 members voting against. If we cannot get it back....
 - Motion Passed (13) Yes to (7) No
- A second motion was made in the event James Clark could not get back the property near 41st and Memorial, that he be allowed to keep looking for suitable facilities that fit within our \$300 to \$500 per month budget Motion Passed (15 Yes to (3) No
- In the Interim, we still meet here at Mazzio's until you are instructed to move to a new location, which will come in all forms of communication we have available to us.

 - Art Ryan and Larry Check were each awarded the Magic Member Award and patch for explementary service to ABATE of Tulsa and of Oklahoma.
 - Magic Member Plaque was created so that all past and current Magic Members have a prominent place to have their names proudly displayed.
 - Nina Dresser to send a Thank You note to Myers Duren for their wonderful Centerpiece they made for us.
- Legislative Day Wednesday March 20th, was also a huge success. We had a nice turnout from Tulsa with several people braving the rain and riding out to the Capital and others driving out the morning of in our cages. 50 people in total turned out from ABATE.
- o COC –also held a Legislative Day 53 people showed up.

New Business:

- May is Motorcycle Awareness Month what do we want to do as a Chapter to celebrate it.
 Perhaps a picnic, or a ride?
- Per the MRF, House of Representatives Introduced a Resolution Addressing Motorcyclist
 Profiling
 - Today champions of the motorcyclist community in the House of Representatives introduced a resolution addressing motorcyclist profiling. The resolution (H. Res. 255) has three key points:
 - (1) promoting increased public awareness on the issue of motorcyclist profiling;
 - (2) encouraging collaboration and communication with the motorcycle community and law enforcement to engage in efforts to end motorcycle profiling; and
 - (3) urging State law enforcement officials to include statements condemning motorcyclist profiling in written policies and training materials.
 - The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) applauds Congressman Walberg (R-MI), Congressman Peterson (D-MN), Congressman Burgess (R-TX) and Congressman Pocan (D-WI) for introducing this bipartisan resolution in the House of Representatives. These four Members of Congress introduced an identical bill in the

last Congress which garnered 37 cosponsors but unfortunately failed to reach the House floor for a vote.

While the previous effort in the House failed, the United States Senate, in December 2018 passed an identical resolution regarding motorcyclist profiling. The MRF was proud to take a leading role in passing this Senate anti-profiling resolution. The United States Senate is now on record calling for the end of motorcyclist profiling.

The MRF is committed to working with the state motorcycle rights organizations (SMROs), coalitions, COC's, the Motorcycle Profiling Project (MPP), the National Council of Clubs (NCOC), the National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM), and independent riders to advance H. Res. 255.

President of the MRF, Kirk 'Hardtail' Willard, stated "We once again thank Congressmen Walberg, Peterson, Burgess and Pocan for their leadership on this important issue. Motorcyclists in every state are impacted by profiling and we appreciate these Congressmen bringing the issue before the House of Representatives."

Please ask your U.S. House of Representative to cosponsor H. Res. 255!

John Pierce suggested sending two people at ABATE's cost to the Biker's In the Beltway the weekend before Memorial Day. The membership approved the expenditure and Cheryl increased the Travel Allowance portion of the budget to account for this.

- Sustaining Membership fee State Board Meeting, found out we have not been paying the Sustaining Membership fee for the past (5) years. Most other ABATE Groups pay \$1,000 (Cheryl can read them off for us if need be) annually at the Board meeting before the budget is read.
 - Quentin Dunn from Heartland Chapter and a former Board Treasurer said Tulsa did pay this in the past when he was a Treasurer but not in the past two year's he was aware of.
 - It was decided that we will not be paying anything beyond the \$250.00 we already paid at the Smile and will budget accordingly going ahead for this in our 2020 budget.
- o Budget for 2019 presented by our Treasurer Cheryl Clark (see attached for records)
 - We read through the proposed budget, made a few changes and tabled taking action on approving the budget until the April 2019 meeting.
 - o 2018 Budget vs. Actual we came in about >\$1,000 under budget.
 - Per James Clark, he would like to see us come up with an investment vehicle by which our excess funds could be invested in to gain interest. Cheryl Clark to explore our options.
 - Cheryl will e-mail out the proposed Budget to everyone this coming month so you all have an opportunity to read it, and print it off for the upcoming April Meeting.
 - o Radar made a request we add a Budget Line Item called Loan to Share the Road
- Watch for Motorcycle Signs
 - Rick Cassaday asked for money from the general fund to invest in "WATCH FOR Motorcycle" signs for around Motorcycle dealerships.

- President Robert Dresser commented that the initial two signs that Rick had gotten approved were paid for by the city of Tulsa. He continued on to say that instead of using our General Funds to buy signs that only benefit these Motorcycle Dealers, would we not be better served going directly to these dealerships with the appropriate marketing materials and a small committee to solicit the funds directly from the affected dealerships and help them clear the city hurdles in getting the signs placed, since we already have the experience in doing so? This way we would not be out of the money we work so hard for and they would get the Safety Signs they need with significant ease.
- In addition, would we also not be better served by going to the current City Administration to see if the City would wish to continue funding these safety signs for the benefit of its local businesses and resident's safety?
- President Dresser was not in favor of using ABATE funds for the benefit of so few people. There was no second to Ricks motion so the motion died on the floor.
- Rose brought up The Meeting of the Minds she asked what it costs to typically send a person to this meeting as they normally pay all their expenses themselves.
 - Per Art, it costs approximately \$150 per night for (3) nights for the room
 - \$80.00 to Register plus travel and food costs on top! Consider at least \$750 per person to attend.
 - Keep in mind the group said we would consider paying for up to (2) people to go to a meeting such as this, and come back with a detailed report as to what went on and what they each learned! So, the total spend for a Meeting of the Minds would be \$1,500
