CAMP DAY

The average day is divided into two morning sessions and two afternoon sessions, with a break in the morning and afternoon, as well as an hour lunch break.

HOURS & SUPERVISION

All camps begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. Students WILL NOT be supervised before 8:30 a.m. or after 4:30 p.m. An additional half-hour of supervision can be requested for \$10/day or \$50/week beyond the included half-hour of care.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Parents/Guardians should accompany students to the sign in table on the first day of camp. Parents may drop off/pick up their child(ren) at the Parent Pickup area located in the front of the campus for the remainder of the week.

BREAKFAST / LUNCH

A "school-type" breakfast and lunch will be provided. Students can bring their own lunches. Low cost snacks and drinks will be available.

INSTRUMENTS

Students must provide their own instruments for all instrumental music camps except Piano, Elementary Music Ensemble and Percussion (please bring drum sticks). Students should mark all of their own equipment with their name.

CAMP FEE

Each camp fee is \$150 per week, which includes activities, breakfast, lunch, and a souvenir t-shirt). No refunds will be issued. Scholarships are available. All information is available on our website. An additional \$15 supply fee may apply to some classes.

WEEK 1: JUNE 18 - 22

• Musical Theatre - Week 1 of 2

Teacher: Erin Cantwell. Musical Theatre Camp is a two week musical theatre experience designed for students ready to develop or increase skills in all areas of musical theatre. Camp activities include learning music, vocal technique, staging, choreography, and rehearsal terminology. Musical Theatre Camp will feature student collaboration in developing a short musical that is performed for family and friends at the end of camp. Registration for both weeks is required.

• Beginning Piano

Teacher: Betsy Randolph. For students of all ages, from grades 3 and up, who have minimal music reading abilities.

• Visual Arts: Collage/Painting & Mixed Media

Teacher: Kellen Beck Mills. Students will explore two-dimensional mixed media and collage techniques. Surrealism and Expressionism will form the basis of technique approaches. A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Culinary Arts - LET'S COOK!!! Food Families

Teacher: Tia Paul. Food Family Trees and yummy things that "grow" from them. Students explore the uniqueness and similarity of different types fruits, vegetables, legumes and more. Students create their own recipe and cookbook to take home. A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Beginning Strings

Teacher: Jonathan Lawrence. For violin, viola or cello students with one year experience, grade 3 and up, must be able to read basic music.

• Flute Ensemble

Teacher: Darbi Elliott Lamrani. The 2018 Flute Ensemble Camp will focus on basic flute techniques, major scales, all-state preparation, and chamber music. All flutists with at least one year of experience are invited to attend.

WEEK 2: JUNE 25 - JUNE 29

• Musical Theatre - Week 2 of 2

Teacher: Erin Cantwell. Registration for both weeks is required.

• Intermediate Piano

Teacher: Betsy Randolph. For students of all ages, from grades 3 and up, who can read music in both clefs and have studied piano for at least two years.

• Visual Arts: Offbeat Art Explorations

Teacher: Patricia Collins. Students will explore mixed media techniques using stencils, rubber stamps, mono-printing, working in small & large scale on projects from artists books to experimenting with 3D forms & collaborating on a mural or installation. We'll look at various contemporary artists throughout the program for inspiration. Students may register for either week 2 or 3 or both weeks. A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Digital Design

Teacher: Vincent Lewis. This course is designed to teach students how to use computer technology to produce an artistic image. Students will learn computer illustration techniques, image manipulation, graphic design and the principles and elements of art in composition.

• Culinary Arts - Wraps, Snacks and More!!

Teacher: Tia Paul. Students learn how to pair foods and create treats and simple meals for any occasion. This is where creativity and cooking come together! A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Beginning Guitar

Teacher: Jonathan Lawrence. Grades 4 and up. For students with little or no prior guitar experience. Students must supply their own Acoustic guitar in good playing condition (bring extra set of strings & three guitar picks).

• Percussion Ensemble

Teacher: Jordan Pickard. For students who have had some music and percussion experience. Please bring a pair of drum sticks and practice pad if available. Students will have fun making music specifically for percussion instruments.

WEEK 3: JULY 9 - JULY 13

• Band - Week 1 of 2

Teacher: Matthew Murrell. For students with a minimum of one year playing experience. Students will take a brief audition for seating. Please prepare eight measures from a piece of your choice for the audition. Registration for both weeks is required.

• Beginning Piano

Teacher: Amy Maneval. For students of all ages, from grades 3 and up, who have minimal music reading abilities.

• Theatre Production (One-Act) - Week 1 of 2

Teacher: Michael Lynch. A two-week acting experience which involves all aspects of theatre, including acting, design and tech. All of this culminates in a performance of a one-act. Registration for both weeks is required. A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Visual Arts: Sculpture and Digital Arts

Teacher: Nicole Bizjak. Students will work with clay and make other 3D sculptures. In addition, they will spend part of each day exploring Microsoft Publisher and Paint. Some activities include creating postcards, bookmarks, and optical illusions. A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Strings Orchestra

Teachers: Kayla Lisa & Nadia Bangash. For violin, viola or cello students with a least two years experience.

• Elementary Music Ensemble

Teachers: Kristen Beattie & Jason Thomashefsky. For students currently in grades 3-5. Students will be exposed to singing, playing instruments and moving to music. Instruments not needed. No experience necessary!

WEEK 4: JULY 16 - JULY 20

• Band - Week 2 of 2

Teacher: Matthew Murrell. For students with a minimum of one year playing experience. Students will take a brief audition for seating. Please prepare eight measures from a piece of your choice for the audition. Registration for both weeks is required.

• Intermediate Piano

Teacher: Amy Maneval. For students of all ages, from grades 3 and up, who can read music in both clefs and have studied piano for at least two years.

• Theatre Production (One-Act) - Week 2 of 2

Teacher: Michael Lynch. Registration for both weeks is required.

• Visual Arts: Mixed Media, Sculpture, and Illustration.

Teacher: Cat Schwartz. Students will work with watercolors, inks, and upcycled papers to create fine art mixed media masterpieces. In addition, they will be spending part of each day creating 3D items such as plushies/soft sculpture animals, trinket boxes, wall hangings, paper mache figures, wearable art pieces, and artful textiles. A \$15 supply fee will apply.

• Digital Design

Teacher: Vincent Lewis. This course is designed to teach students how to use computer technology to produce an artistic image. Students will learn computer illustration techniques, image manipulation, graphic design and the principles and elements of art in composition.
