The majority of the fleet were ECYC boats joined by others from the North Cove, Hamburg Cove, Niantic Bay, Duck Island, Essex, and Pettipaug Yacht Clubs. Other crews hailed from the Essex Station of the Cruising Club of America, Off Soundings, and Cove Landing Marina. Traveling the farthest was Zefiro Torna (Norman Angus) from the Old Greenwich Yacht Club. The fleet ranged from serious racing yachts to casual cruisers to a beautiful Sparkman & Stevens 48 sloop piloted by John Leonard of Cove Landing Marina. John was an early member of ECYC and today manages our Hamburg Cove mooring.

We also welcomed several ECYC boats to their first Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association points race. A points race is a sanctioned ECSA regatta that counts towards seasonal honors, thus requiring a high standard of race management by our Race Committee.

Our Race Committee was led on the water by Vice Commodore Steve Rodstrom who provided his Bertram 28, "Osprey", as the RC boat. We engaged Greg Gilmartin and Frank Murphy of the Mystic Mudheads as our Primary Race Officials. Also helping on board Osprey was Cate Beckstein.

Osprey was assisted by a mark boat manned by Adam McEwen and the chase boat, "Alto Mare", Donna and Eric Altomare's 38 foot motor yacht, assisted on board by Past Vice Commodore Don Shannehan.

The start line was just south of Fenwick and west of the Outer Light. The race course was indeed a "Cross Sound Challenge", requiring the fleet to proceed through a "gate" bound by Bell 8 (the namesake of our newsletter) and the buoy marking the end of Long Sand Shoal. From the gate, the course took the fleet to a turning mark located just north of Truman Beach on the north fork between Orient Point and Greenport.

The fleet met a brisk southerly breeze on the trip south to Truman Beach, challenging crews to manage shifting winds and a ebb tide as they approached the mark. On the chase boat, Eric, Donna and Don were entertained watching the fleet go around the mark, some better than others!

Once by the mark, boats hoisted every piece of canvas they could for a rousing downwind run back to the gate and then home to the finish line off Fenwick.

After finishing, boat crews returned to ECYC for what many said was one of the best parties on the ECSA circuit. The club was packed on both floors sharing stories from the day in anticipation of the announcement of results.

Tom Clark Memorial Race - Tri-Club River Race Series

A very special ECYC tradition is the annual Tom Clark Memorial Race on Saturday, October 11th. The Clark Race is the second leg of the Tri-Club River Series held in collaboration with the Essex Yacht Club's Thomas Willets Memorial Race on Saturday, October 4th and the Pettipaug Yacht Club's Charles Birch Memorial Race.

Each race is named in honor of a special member from that Club. In our case, Tom Clark was a renowned Essex sailmaker who was a friendly fixture among the Essex boating community and early member of the club. He sadly passed away in 1988. Past Commodore Jim Nash and his wife Liz donated the Clark Race Trophy in his memory and the race has been run each year since 1991. Tom's wife Molly is one our club's two honorary members (Dr. Robert Ballard is the other).

All ECYC sailors are encouraged to register and sail. Each race will feature a cruising class (or classes depending on the fleet) for boats with PHRF ratings and an Ideal 18 class. The Clark Race will also be open to other one design classes like Lasers, 420's Blue Jays, and MC Scows.

The Cruising boat with the best combined result across all three races will win the Tri Club River Race Trophy currently held by Jeff Going and Ed Birch in Celebration.

The 2014 Fall Frostbite season sails off Sunday, October 5th. ECYC's Ideal 18 and Etchells racing crews will be back in action. Interested racers should contact Fleet Captain Jon Gibbs to get on the crew schedule.

John Philip Sousa Award Nominations

Please let Rear Commodore Ruth Emblin of your nominations for the John Philips Sousa Award, given to ECYC yacht that had the most impressive voyage of the year. We are looking to the yachts that sailed the greatest distance from Essex.

Green Tip Of The Month

The boating season is slowly winding down for many of us in our area (unless you are one of the lucky ones with a heater on board). Nevertheless here is a list of tips to consider to keep your boating "clean and green"!

1. Prevent oily discharges from the bilge. Keep your engine well tuned to prevent fuel and oil leaks. Secure an oil absorbent pad or pillow in your bilge and under your engine where drips may occur. Check the pads often, do not let them clog the bilge pump, and dispose of them as hazardous waste at a marina or local hazardous waste collection center.



- Spill-proof your oil changes. For oil changes, use an oil change pump to transfer oil to a spill-proof container. Wrap a plastic bag or absorbent pad around the oil filter to prevent oil from spilling into the bilge.
- 3. When fueling, stop the drops! Prevent fuel spills by filling fuel tanks slowly and using absorbent pads or rags to catch drips and spills. Don't "top off" or overflow your fuel tank. Leave the tank 10% empty to allow fuel to expand as it warms.
- 4. Do not add soap. Never use soap to disperse fuel and oil spills. It increases harm to the environment, and it is illegal.
- Minimize boat cleaning and maintenance in the water. If possible, save maintenance projects for the boatyard. When performing work on the water minimize your impact by containing waste. Use tarps and vacuum sanders to collect all drips and debris for proper disposal.
- 6. Reduce toxic discharges from bottom paints. Minimize the discharge of heavy metals found in soft-sloughing antifouling paints by using a less toxic, or nontoxic antifouling paint. Use only non-abrasive underwater hull cleaning techniques to prevent excessive paint discharge. Remember, dry storage reduces the need for antifouling paints and saves money.
- 7. Dispose of hazardous waste properly. Dispose of paints, batteries, antifreeze, cleaning products, oil, oil filters and other hazardous wastes at a hazardous waste collection facility or event

It's also time to start thinking of tasks to be completed during the annual shutdown period in January. The galley will be the primary attention area this year. Appliances will be thoroughly cleaned, floor cleaned and sealed, refrigeration units professionally reconditioned, walls painted, windows repaired and cleaned. There will be multiple work days scheduled to complete these tasks, stay tuned.

Well that just about exhausts me for today, just thinking about what needs to be done. As has always been the past, I know volunteers will be there to help out once the call goes out.

- 8. Plan A-head! Manage sewage wastes properly. Never discharge sewage within 3 miles of shore. Use harbor pump-out stations and shore-side facilities. If you don't have an installed toilet, use a portapotty and empty it at a harbor dump station or bathroom.
- Stow it, don't throw it! Keep your trash on board. Never throw
 cigarette butts, fishing line, or any other garbage into the ocean. Take
 advantage of shore-side facilities to recycle plastic, glass, metal, and
 paper.
- 10. Reduce Greywater discharges. Use a phosphate-free biodegradable soap to minimize the impacts of greywater on the marine environment. Also minimize discharge by doing dishes and showers on shore whenever possible.
