Snow Removal Policy

The Town of Rockford believes that it is in the best interest of the residents for the town to assume basic responsibility for control of snow and ice on town streets. Reasonable ice and snow control is necessary for routine travel and emergency services. The town will provide such control in a safe and cost effective manner, keeping in mind safety, budget, personnel and environmental concerns. The town will utilize town employees, equipment and/or private contractors to provide this service. For a copy of the policy in it's entirety, please contact Town Hall.

The Public Works operator will decide when to begin snow or ice control operations.

SIDEWALKS

The town will make an effort to remove snow from the downtown area sidewalks, provided personnel and funds are available. Business owners should not assume the town will be solely responsible for the sidewalks in front of their businesses. It will be necessary for business owners to work in conjunction with town personnel to keep the sidewalks snow and ice free.

RESIDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY

Residents are responsible for snow removal on the sidewalks in front of their property. The town is not responsible for driveways. You should expect to have to keep your driveway open. If at all possible, refrain from parking vehicles on the street when it's likely that plowing will be necessary.
