I still remember my first bicycle. That first bike, to me it was the first big thing that was mine. It wasn't a hand-me-down, it wasn't used, it was new and it was mine. The red paint shined bright against the black pedals; it was beautiful. My parents made a big deal about how this was a new bike and about how they expected me to take good care of it. I couldn't leave it out in the rain anything like that. It was a nice new bike and I had to be responsible for taking care of it and making sure nothing happened to it. Soon after getting it, I had to take it over to my friend's house. My friend lived just through the woods and we often got together to play throughout the summer. So I rode my bike to his house to show it off. It wasn't long before we were riding around his house, and the woods, and everywhere else. So there I was riding with my friend and we were seeing who could ride further down the steep hill behind his house. Not wanting to be outdone I rode a little too far and too fast and lost control and started down the steep hill. About halfway down the front wheel turned sideways throwing me into the air and leaving the bike twisted up on the hill side. I remember my friend's dad came running down the hill to see if I was okay, which I was, at least until I saw my bike. The front wheel was turned 90 degrees off from the front handle bars. I had broken the brand-new bike my parents had trusted me with. I was heartbroken, I was distraught, I think I even asked my friend's parents if I could move in with them so that my parents wouldn't kill me. I remember the neighbor carrying me inside and calling my mom to let her know what happened. She drove the old station wagon up to get me. I think I spent the next day or two in hiding. I had such guilt over breaking my brand new bike. Mom noticed that I was moping around and asked what was wrong. I didn't know how to respond so I just said, "the bike". Mom had a puzzled look on her face so I clarified. "aren't you mad about what I did to the bike?" She said, "the bike? What's wrong with the bike?" I said, "I broke it remember". She said, "Oh that, I had forgotten all about that. The neighbor fixed it when I picked you up the other day, it's in the shed ready to go". That bike is still at my parent's home, and yes, my children have ridden it.


What stands out to me in this story is not that a little kid's bike was easily fixed, but that my mother had so quickly forgotten an offense that I thought would land me in a guillotine. She had forgotten my crime. The terrible deed I had done was no longer in her memory. She remembered it no more! As I got older the frequency and severity of my faltering increased; but thankfully, mom never stopped being my mom, and I never stopped being her son. Forgiveness is the main reason for that. The scriptures use this kind of language in Jeremiah to describe the relationship between God and God's people. Jeremiah 31:33-34 says, "This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the Lord. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the Lord. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

God will be our God and we will be God's people! God will remember our sins no more! Friends, as we go through this season of lent I invite you to seek forgiveness from your God. For your God is the most loving parent imaginable and is eagerly waiting your confession of guilt. And God promises that when we confess and repent from our wrong doing, God will no longer remember the mistakes we have made. This means that no matter how bad you think you were, no matter what you have done or what skeletons lie in your past, confess and be freed. Feel the forgiveness won for us through Jesus Christ, and know that God is ready to forget any faults you may have. God promises, "I will remember their sin NO MORE"! Which begs the question, if God is ready to forget our sin, why aren't we?

Find ONE person during Lent and invite them to come with you to Sunday School and church. The best way to make a difference is to encourage someone to claim their faith in Jesus Christ!










MUP Church Facelift

- 5. VBS tentatively scheduled for July

- 7.Session approved the matching of funds collected for any fundraiser/special collection, excluding capital campaigns. This is designed for "outward" mission.

- 9. Painting of Sanctuary completed payment approved; Social Hall Baseboard has arrived; Ladies Room renovation will begin sometime in March




Mars United Presbyterian Church Daily Lenten Readings 2023
