

PARLIAMENT NOTES FOR CMS USA MEMBERS

PARLIAMENT 2023 PROGRAMME. There are two major parts to Parliament 2023, the pre-Parliament trip to Mull and Iona, and Parliament week in Dunvegan:

- The pre-Parliament trip to Mull and Iona. This begins on the morning of Wednesday 19th July when we take the ferry over to Mull (www.isle-of-mull.net) from Oban. On Thursday we continue to Iona, and end when we return by ferry back to Oban. These are beautiful islands, deeply steeped in art, music, and history. Iona was a centre of the early 20th century Celtic arts revival led by artists such as Euphemia and Alexander Ritchie. You may know that the first seven Chiefs of the Clan MacLeod are all buried at the Iona Abbey. The cost for this excursion is GBP£362 per person, and includes Wednesday and Thursday night accommodation, coach and ferry transportation, entry to all exhibits, an evening meal for us all together with entertainment (on Wednesday), a packed lunch on Thursday, and gratuities. We are planning for about 30 MacLeods on this trip; the cost may be slightly adjusted based on the number who attend. Register now while the exchange rate between the USA dollar and the British pound is favourable!
- Parliament week in Dunvegan. We return to the stomping ground of Dunvegan for another week of tartan, family, victuals, dancing, learning, piping, laughing, and the making of old and new friends. Elsewhere in this CMS USA newsletter there are more details about the Dunvegan programme. We will also visit the Isle of Raasay on Wednesday 26th July for a day that will feature tours of Raasay House and the restored gardens, a visit to the Raasay Distillery, all-day hospitality at the Raasay Community Hall, self-guided visits to local artists and the Raasay Heritage Centre, hill walking if you have a mind to do it, and excursions by minibus to more remote sites such as Brochel Castle and Calum's Road. You may also book recreational activities on your own at the Raasay Outdoor Centre. The highpoint of the day will be the traditional MacLeod tug-of-war heats that take place on the lawn in front of Raasay House.
- The North Room Group. At every Parliament, young MacLeods between the ages of 18 and 30 are invited to join together in fun and service, and to make lifelong friendships within the Clan. In recent years, this has meant that the NRG was housed separately from the rest of the Parliamentarians and independently completed a service project, usually on the Dunvegan Estate. This year, the NRG will not be following a pre-defined programme. Early in the week, they will have the opportunity to meet and decide how they would like to spend the week. It is up to them to decide how closely integrated they wish to be with the rest of Parliament. There will be no accommodation or food allowance provided, but we will support any logistical requests they have for transportation, tools, or activity space.

PARLIAMENT REGISTRATION IS OPEN. This may be old news to those of you who spend time on social media, but Parliament registration is open on the wwww.clanmacleod.org website. There you can sign up for Parliament week in Dunvegan. Questions about the Dunvegan programme or the North Room Group should be sent to parliament@clanmacleod.org. If you are interested in the Mull and Iona pre-Parliament trip the website also has a way to get in touch with the trip leader, Kevin Tolmie. (Kevin is a professional tour guide, Vice-President of CMS Scotland, our Clan MacLeod Magazine Editor, and the person who led the Harris and Lewis pre-Parliament trip in 2018.)

THERE WILL BE AN INFORMATION POINT IN THE DUNVEGAN VILLAGE HALL. Throughout the week, there will be a table set up in Dunvegan Hall to answer any questions that come up. This will include extra copies of leaflets, a lost and found, and MacLeod merchandise for sale. This includes goods from ACMS or National or Regional Societies. Please note that there is no location for the sale of personal goods at Parliament. Tammie Vawter, CMS USA RVP for the Pacific Region is also the Merchandise Manager for ACMS. She is arranging for some USA items to be available. Contact her (mrs_califmacleod@yahoo.com) if you have any questions or suggestions.

PARLIAMENT ACTIVITIES THAT WILL BE IMPROVED BY CMS USA PARTICIPATION.

If you have questions about any of the activities below, please contact Dorna.

- **CMS USA AGM.** There will be a CMS USA Annual General Meeting on Monday morning 24th July from 09.00AM to 11.00AM in the Norman Magnus Room of the Dunvegan Community Hall.
- **Dunvegan Foundation AGM.** If time allows, the AGM for the Dunvegan Foundation will follow the CMS USA AGM, although both meetings need to be over by 11.00AM. If the Dunvegan Foundation needs more time or would refer a smaller venue, that meeting information will be available in Dunvegan Hall and announced at the CMS USA AGM.
- CMS USA National Tea on Tuesday. There will be "National Teas" each morning when we are in Dunvegan (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday). CMS USA will host our morning tea in Dunvegan Hall on Tuesday 25th July. This is an opportunity to share a bit of our breakfast cuisine and hospitality with MacLeods from other nations. If you can bring something to share, help serve, decorate with the stars and stripes, or just attend and socialise, please join us. (Parliament will provide coffee and tea, cups and utensils, and some basic nibbles. If you would like to be part of this event contact Robin Ingram rmcleodingram@hotmail.com.
- **Silent Auction**. The Parliament Silent Auction will be held in the Dunvegan Hall Sports Hall (the big room) on Tuesday evening, alongside the Whisky Tasting event. The money raised at the Silent Auction becomes the seed money for the next Parliament, in 2026. The Whisky Tasting is of course juxtaposed next to the Silent Auction in order to aid in the bidding process. If you have items to donate, they can be left at the Hall's Information Point at any time prior to the Auction.
- A la carte Parliament activities. There will be a few ticketed activities at Parliament, for which you must book and pay for yourself (one person at a time). On Wednesday, there will be a one-hour distillery tour on Raasay, and on Thursday there will be a guided water tour of Loch Dunvegan by Skyebased www.gotostkilda.co.uk. It will be possible to book these on the www.clanmacleod.org website after 1st May when the prices are finalised (we think each one will be GBP£15 per person.) Any tickets not sold by the time of Parliament Registration will be for sale at the Information Point.
- **Flowers of the forest.** On Sunday 23th July, Parliamentarians will attend the morning service at the Duirinish Parish Church in Dunvegan. We are invited to share the names of MacLeods who have passed away since the last Parliament, and which will be read aloud in remembrance during the service. If you have a name that you would like to have read aloud, please contact Dorna. The person so remembered does not have to be a card-carrying Clan MacLeod member, but a person of significance to us. (The names of pets are not appropriate.)
- No St. Kilda trip is planned. There is no trip to St. Kilda planned this year, but if you want to make arrangement for your own trip contact enquiries@www.gotostkilda.co.uk. This is truly a bucket-list worthy adventure.
- **Volunteering**. If you would like to generally help out with Parliament in any way, there are many opportunities to volunteer. Contact Rory McLeod at parliament@clanmacleod.org if you are interested.
- **Travel.** Typically, when a MacLeod plans to go to Parliament, s/he first arranges accommodation, then airfare, and almost as an afterthought will finally register. Please register as soon as you can! Accommodation can be found on the internet. And travel is likely to be more of a challenge than at Parliaments in the past.
 - COVID (and other) requirements for entering the UK can be found at www.gov.uk/uk-border-control; COVID requirements for returning to the USA can be found at www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/international-travel-during-covid19.html.
 - o Good values in AIRFARES are hard to come by, even if you purchase your airfare early. Be prepared to spend time looking around. I have found two good value sources online, but they

aren't logistically convenient for the entire USA and therefore require connecting flights. USA cities that are close to the border may be able to take advantage of Canadian airline WestJet (www.westjet.com/en-us), and a new North-America-to-Europe, long-haul airline FlyNorse (www.flynorse.com) has some great fares but not a lot of departure points from the USA yet. Aerligus and Iceland Air can get you to Glasgow without going through London or mainland Europe.

- The Parliamentarian's Handbook. This clever little booklet has been a helpful aid to MacLeods in the past, especially those who are travelling overseas for the first time. The 2023 revision will be available at www.clanmacleod.org after 1st May. If you would like to see an older copy before then, please contact Dorna.

Story - The Loch Ness Monster, also known as Nessie (this is a repeat)

The Loch Ness Monster is an unknown sea creature that lives in Loch Ness in Inverness, Scotland. She is said to be a large, long-necked creature with at least one hump on her back and a long tail. We have lovingly named her Nessie. She is often said to be green or brown. This creature has been sighted in the loch since 565 A.D., over 1500 years ago! In 565 AD, St. Columba, an Irish monk, was staying nearby and witnessed Nessie and wrote down what he saw. It has been seen in the loch ever since and documented often, all the way to modern times.

Several different groups have tried to do scientific explorations to find if the creature is real, but while no one has ever found proof, the sightings still occur often. To this day, if you visit Scotland, you can visit the Loch Ness Center and Exhibition to see all about those who have searched, been documented, what they are doing to still explore the loch, and of course, get a few goodies and toys of Nessie as well.

Even without absolute proof of her existence, many still believe, and people search for her daily. If you get permission from a parent, you can even go to www.lochness.co.uk/livecam/ and watch the waters yourself to see if you can spot Nessie as she swims through the loch.

So let us know. What do you think? Do you believe Nessie is real? Or has everyone seen something else that they thought was Nessie?

Craft: Nessie!

Supplies:

3 Pieces of construction paper (1 white, 1 blue, and 1 green)

1 pair of scissors (please ask an adult for help)

1 Black Marker

Crayons/Markers/Paint

Glue or tape



- 1. Using the white piece of construction paper, we will draw her head, body, and tail onto it, as shown in the first photo, using a black marker. Once that is completed, flip the paper over. Trace the black lines you can see through the paper from the other side. You now have the figures on both sides of the paper. Make sure the tabs at the bottom are there! They will be VERY important soon.
- 2. Now, color her in on both sides using your crayon, marker, or paint. Remember, use your imagination and make her look however you think she should because no one knows for sure! The drawing you see is how I picture her.
- 3. Cut her out, again making sure the tabs are left on the bottom of each portion as shown in the above photo.
- 4. Take your blue paper and cut around the edges to make it look more like the edge of the water, something like the second photo above
- 5. Next, take your Nessie cut-outs and place them where you will want them on the blue paper. Then using your black marker, put black lines at the bottom of where the tabs are, like in the photo above. Then cut just along those black lines.
- 6. Now place the tabs through the lines you just cut, fold them over, and tape them to the back side of the blue paper.
- 7. Lastly, take your blue paper with Nessie on top and the tabs on the bottom and tape or glue it to the center of the green piece of paper. See the third photo above for an idea of what the project will look like
- 8. DONE! Now you have your own Nessie swimming through Loch Ness!
