


Here were some of the bids you were considering, and their meaning;

```
2 Spades = 6 - 9 points with 6+ Spades
3 Spades = 10 - 12 points with 6+ Spades
2 NT = 10 - 12 points
3 NT = 13 - 17 points
```

It would seem that, given the above choices, one of the No-Trump bids would be the best. There is a problem with these choices however. If North has 3 Spades, our best contract is likely to be 4 Spades.

Note: North's bid of 1NT denies 4 card Spade support. North could still have 3 card support for the Spade suit. So how do we find out if we have a Spade fit on these auctions?



We use New Minor Forcing for these types of hands.





RULES

New Minor Forcing will only be used in non-competitive auctions and only after minor-major-NT auctions (see below)



On both of these auctions, the bid of 2 Clubs, by South, would be "New Minor Forcing"





On both of these auctions, the bid of 2 Diamonds, by South, would be "New Minor Forcing"

So... What is New Minor Forcing?

After a minor-major-NT auction, the bid of the New Minor (unbid) suit is ARTIFICIAL and FORCING.

We use this new minor bid as a means to find the best strain (major suit or NT) and the appropriate level for our collective values.

- 10+ Points - 5+ Cards in the responder's major suit

Let's take a look at this bid in action...







RESPONDING TO NEW MINOR FORCING

When responding to New Minor Forcing, the opener has two priorities:

Show or deny 3 card support for partner's Major Bidding partner's major (any level) = 3 card support

- · Bidding NT or another suit denies 3 card support

- Accept or decline partner's invitation
 On these auctions, opener's range will almost always be
 - Responding at the lowest level (i.e. 2 Spades) = 12 13
 - · Responding by bidding game (i.e. 3NT) = a good 13 14

So... What is New Minor Forcing?

New minor forcing is one of the most aptly named conventions in bridge.

After a minor-major-NT auction, the bid of the **New Minor** (unbid) suit is **ARTIFICIAL and FORCING**.


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
New Minor Forcing shows two things:


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




2 Diamonds here is New Minor Forcing.

We do not know which game is best yet, because we have not ruled out the possibility of a heart fit.

So, New Minor Forcing tells partner we have at least 10 points and 5 or more cards in the Heart suit.




2 Clubs on this auction is New Minor Forcing. We have an invitational hand but which game do we invite to?

The answer is **BOTH!**

Remember, New Minor Forcing is at least invitational and shows 5+ in our Major suit.

After this bid, partner should know we have invitational values or better and 5 Spades minimum.

RESPONDING TO NEW MINOR FORCING


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 12 14 points, So...
 - Responding at the lowest level (i.e. 2 Spades) = 12 13
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




What would you respond as South with each of these hands?

On this hand we bid 2 Spades. This showed:

- 3 Card Support for Spades
- A minimum hand (11 13)















On this hand we bid 3NT.
Remember, New Minor Forcing is Invitational or better.

We have a hand that would accept an invitation (good 14), so we deny 3 card Heart support but show enough values for game with our bid of 3NT

SPECIAL SITUATIONS




This hand shows a special circumstance. We have 3 card support for partner's Spade suit, but we also have 4 Hearts giving us two potential bids. So which do we choose?

This is based on partnership agreement. Some partnerships agree to bid the 4 card major 1st, others agree to always show 3 card support for partner's bid major 1st.

The most Basic agreement (easiest) is to always show 3 card support in partner's Major.

Based on this agreement we would bid 2 Spades with the hand above.



Is South's 3 Diamond bid New Minor Forcing?


Yes it is, except this no longer shows 10+ points.

Because 2NT shows 18 - 19 points, we need only a good 6+ to make our New Minor Forcing Bid.

This would still guarantee 5+ cards in the Heart suit.



On the above auction, where no minor suits have been bid, most pairs would agree that 2 Clubs will be New Minor Forcing.




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
