

She kept busy helping with grandchildren, Ryan O'Connor, Stefanie Shosky, Christine Harwood, Alexandra Rush, and Sean O'Connor. She hosted many birthday and holiday dinners with Christmas Eve Swedish "Smorgasbord" being the most important, always including meatballs, pickled herring and lots of
