Mr. Zrenchak stated that McKeesport has looked into purchasing flow meters to go towards their billing. He is looking into getting pricing for next month's meeting to purchase a laser flow meter for our pump station so we can make sure that what we are sending them and what they are billing us is accurate.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Larry Sikorski, Mayor

Mayor Sikorski reported that the police department had a total of 109 calls – Alexander Appleby handled 2, Michael Birchfield handled 7, Nicholas Caito handled 32, John Mayernik handled 52,

Matthew McDanel handled 3, and Zachaery Stumpf handled 13. He explained that the numbers are misleading because 2 of the officers are full-time and the rest are part-time.

## **SOLICITOR'S REPORT:** Matt Racunas

Solicitor Racunas stated that after the workshop meeting, he was able to review the police department's policy and procedure manual. It is acceptable and has been adopted. (A motion was made and passed at the August 2021 meeting to approve the manual contingent on Solicitor Racunas' final approval.)

# ENGINEER'S REPORT: Laura Branthoover

They sent a letter to the Allegheny County Economic Development to receive reimbursement for the 2018 street resurfacing program in the amount of \$100,000.

They applied for a grant for the Act 152 demolition of the old school and, unfortunately, we were not granted the \$250,000.

The old school demolition specs were sent to Carla at Steel River COG for advertisement.

The Scene Ridge Plan II was approved by the Allegheny County Department of Development and a letter was given to the recorder of deeds on August  $23^{rd}$ .

Don Glenn sent in the extra items for the GTRP grant for Manor Park. They are waiting on approval.

There are loads of millings that will be delivered next week to the public works garage.

The GEDTF grant application is due at the end of October for paving, storm sewers, recreation, and demo. A motion needs to be made at the next meeting. Mr. Zrenchak asked council to think of projects for the next meeting.

The last item is the Pennsylvania Intermodal Sidewalks. Mr. Zrenchak said that is something they can look into for Liberty Way.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Mr. Zrenchak explained that with the new Quality of Life Ordinance they are looking for letters of interest for people to sit on the Quality of Life appeal board. If anyone is interested in being on

that board, please send a letter to the borough. This will be a board of 3 people to hear appeals for fines for the Quality of Life Ordinance.

Mr. Zrenchak explained that we are also looking for letters of interest for a Blight Committee. There seems to be a lot of people talking on Facebook that nothing is getting done on Liberty Way. This is everyone's chance, instead of posting on Facebook, to decide how to revitalize Liberty Way. Anyone who is interested. Please submit a letter. Maybe someone will think of something that council would not think of. Mr. Gretz added that the state enacted Act 152 which is when a mortgage and deed changes hands there is money collected. Liberty Borough was not accepted for any of that. There was \$1,935,076 that was disbursed to communities. Representative Bob Macy represents us and we got none of that money. Some communities have more blight than we do but we received nothing. He said that Rep. Bob Macy should stop in to see us. We are all looking for extra money. Mr. Zrenchak added that he thinks that it would help if the residents put pressure on the Representatives by calling and sending letters as well as council reaching out.

Mr. Zrenchak stated that Liberty Borough is going to have a clean-up day in conjunction with Lincoln Borough October 16. There will be some more details to follow. There will be 2 dumpsters that residents can put anything they went into and another for electronics. It is free of charge

Mr. Zrenchak said that we are have an issue with dogs being unleashed or not contained. We have an ordinance pertaining to this and so does Allegheny County. Please make sure you keep your dogs leashed or contained in the yard. We have had numerous incidents where people are walking, and dogs have come out of their yard. Mrs. Wall said that it happened to her that morning. The dog was tied up and the dog broke its' leash and went after her.

Mr. Zrenchak reported that there is an Allegheny Count Covid 19 Utility Assistance Program. It is for Pa American Water and waste water customers. There are some eligibility requirements and information on how to apply. He will have it put on our website and Savvy Citizen to get the information out there.

Mr. Gretz spoke about unlicensed vehicles, go carts, quads – he called Lt. Caito about a couple of kids going up Scene Ridge. He is concerned there may be an accident. There have been tragic accidents with these types of vehicles.

Mr. Gretz wants to start a farmer's market partnering with the students. He is looking at a tentative date of August 2022. They have a program at the school that the county works with on how to grow crops. It is a lifelong activity. He wanted to do this prior to covid. It will get residents together and involved on a Saturday morning.

Mrs. Matyasovsky stated that she went to the school board meeting last night to ask what their plans were for the ECC because it is sitting there empty. They said they really did not have any plans. It is shuttered right now but they are not going to abandon it. Maybe if they work on the elementary school, they may have to move some of the kids down there. Mr. Gretz had the same conversation with the assistant to the Superintendent and the Superintendent. The board's decision is to put it into a hovering situation because of a number of things that have taken place. The board

and administration's plan is to look at maybe potentially doing something with it – a fitness center or community center but for right now they are on hold. Mrs. McClelland said she may be extra sensitive to it because she lives directly across from it. If they were maintaining it a little better, the residents would not mind as much. Back in August, the weeds were so bad that there were snakes in them. Mike called the school and was told it was a mulch issue. She said that it is a legitimate reason, but they can still maintain the weeds. Mr. Bogdan saw someone cutting grass and asked when the hillside would be addressed. He said he would be back but he did not return. Mr. Gretz said that the superintendent said to email or stop with any questions or concerns.
