The Fair reserves the right to reject an exhibit not in good taste or not of merit in promoting agriculture or agribusiness. No Grange exhibit to receive any moneys unless deemed worthy by the judges.

No plastic vegetables or fruit to be used unless that is the theme.

No exhibit to be removed before 9:00 pm on Saturday.

Judging to be according to the following plan:

1. Attracts attention - 20 points

Use of color, motion, light, figures. While attention getting important, the reaction should be favorable. Unfavorable attention defeats its purpose.

2. Arouse interest - 25 points

Encourage additional study. Personal appeal to the type of viewer for whom the exhibit is designed.

3. Conveys message - 20 points

The message should be understandable to the viewer for whom the exhibit is designed.

4. Design - 15 points

Elements of the exhibit should be a part of the design and not something apparently added as an afterthought. Simplicity is the key here.

5. Theme - 5 points

Must have theme in exhibit.

Workmanship - 5 points

Neat, well constructed for the purpose. This does not imply that expensive material were used

Originality - 10 points
