

BY LAWS OF THE APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

Article VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- Creation and Formation
- Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- Washing of feet
- Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Lyndel Floyd Arnall, a minister of God, has fought the good fight of faith and now rests until God calls him to eternity. He was born March 28, 1950 at Tipton Ford, MO to Floyd and Lora Arnall. Lyndel lost his father when he was 12 years old and his mother died of cancer when he was 27. One of seven children, Lyndel grew up mostly in the Joplin, MO area. Knowing the call on his life, Lyndel attended Bible College in Tulsa, OK, the Apostolic Faith Bible College in Baxter Springs, KS and the Bible Institute of Holy Land Studies in Jerusalem, Israel. He married Katherine Marie Ruiz in 1969 and their daughter Lynette was born in 1970. Lyndel adored Kathy and they were married over 42 years. In 2008 their home was destroyed by a tornado. Though this was a traumatic event, they praised God continually through the hard time. Over the course of their 42 years together, they lived and ministered in Pine Hill, AL, Prosperity, MO, Kingsmill,TX, Bayard, NE, Baxter Springs, KS and Neosho, MO. Lyndel also dedicated over 30 years to teaching in the Apostolic Faith Bible College. He loved teaching at the college.

In June 2010 while holding a Prophecy Seminar in San Diego, CA, Lyndel was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. The love he was shown by his friends during that time blessed him so much. The Homer Allen family was God's hand extended during the eight weeks Lyndel and Kathy stayed with them. So many dear brothers and sisters in Christ ministered to him even daily during those difficult months. Lyndel went through surgery and treatment and was prayed for by an untold number of people. After biopsies were taken in February of 2011 Lyndel was given the wonderful news that he was cancer free. A few months later in July 2011 came the sudden and surprising diagnosis of cancer on the liver and on January 5th, 2012, Lyndel passed away peacefully at his home in Neosho, Mo. John and Kathy Arnall spent the weeks prior staying with Lyndel and Katherine helping to care for and minister to the entire family. Lyndel had a wonderful attitude of submitting to God's will for his life, as seen in this quote from one of his written testimonies:

"Many precious friends and family called and shared words of encouragement. Their expression of love was such a blessing. The main thought that kept going through my mind was that I want God to be glorified. I was then, and am now afraid that I will do or say something that will obscure the glory of the Lord. I desired with all my heart that whether I lived or died that it would be to the glory of the Lord."-Lyndel Arnall.

Lyndel had many interests and hobbies and was a jack of all trades, skilled in many areas, though equally as accident prone! He loved working on projects around the house, family get-togethers with his brothers and sisters, and most of all playing with his grandchildren. Lyndel visited with his granddaughters Molly and Madison nearly every day and spent many hours each week playing with them. From tea- parties to weddings, fishing to fort building, papa was happy to do whatever they wanted. Lyndel devoted his life to his family. He couldn't have been a better husband, father and grandfather. He loved his son-in-law, Charlie, as his own son and shared a close relationship with him. We miss him more than words can say, and miss the example he led our family by, but we are comforted in knowing that it won't be too long before we see him again... and that we were blessed to have had him - Lynette Brown

"...As I walk the last mile of this road I have no intention of wasting the opportunities that will come in relationship to this cancer. One of the things that occurs when one finds out that they have a life threatening disease is they give more thought to dying. I don't suppose any of us like to think about dying; but the truth is that we will all die if Jesus doesn't return first. Psalms 90:12 says, "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom." Numbering our days means thinking about how few they are, and that they will end. How quickly the days pass and our life slips away. What a waste of an opportunity, if this experience doesn't cause those that are around me to stop and give some thought about the fact that this life and body is temporary; if it doesn't cause people to think about what is really important and to re-evaluate their priorities. Paul said in Romans 8:22-23,: "For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now, and not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit the redemption of our body." - Lyndel Arnall

In the November-December issue of the Apostolic Faith Report an obituary was included for our dear friend and sister in the Lord, Lavonda Wallis. In that article the funeral home had reported Pastor Phil Taylor as ministering. Bro. Phil did open the service with prayer and welcomed everyone. Those that spoke were Kandy Sharp(daughter of Jim and Lavonda Wallis) Randy Wallis (son of Jim and Lavonda Wallis) and Bro. Jim Wallis. Kandy and Randy each gave eulogies for their mother and Bro. Jim gave the main message honoring her life and ministry. We all realize how hard that was for them but Bro Wallis assures us that "the Lord was gracious to each of them and gave strength by the Holy Spirit".

As I read the testimony that Bro. Wallis sent with the correction, it reminded me of an incident that happened many years ago. I remembered as an 18 year old, a 1958 revival that was conducted by Bro. & Sis. Wallis in Joplin, MO. In that revival I saw with my eyes and in my spirit something in their lives that I needed. That was the Lord Jesus Christ as Saviour. Through the years I have been privileged to know them and see that they were right so many years ago. It does pay to serve God and He will never fail. I thank the Lord for their example to so many of us. Praise be unto our Lord!






A Night Vision by Fred Huff
