Our Human Trafficking Awareness 5k walk/run had to remain virtual, but as Covid restrictions eased, it was a pleasure to be in Royal Oak to view the documentary *Men Who Buy Sex: Everybody Pays* in the company of our Soroptimist friends.

Fundraising achieved new heights in spite of Covid's persistence. This year we were able to give four Live Your Dream Awards with one of our awardees continuing on to win at District, Midwestern and Federation levels. Two very deserving women won Ruby Awards, six high school girls won the opportunity to attend an SAT/ACT Preparation Course, and a previous LYD award winner made an encore appearance as our Virginia Wagner Award recipient. And the Continuing Education Award went to a previous LYD award winner who is fulfilling her dream of becoming a nurse. Mentoring continues, stronger than ever, with a new group of dedicated mentors and very excited mentees!

Dream It, Be It hit some potholes and icy patches with Covid outbreaks and staffing shortages at Positive Images, but financial support from the Ralph C. Wilson Foundation and a new virtual platform using Chromebooks with Google Classroom allowed the program to continue. With the grant, we expanded our reach with Healthy Cooking and Computer Classes.

We haven't hit the end of the road. We are ending our term as co-presidents and look forward to new beginnings, not only for the Club, but for ourselves as we all travel new paths.

# Healthy (AND FUN) Cooking at Positive Images



#### WARNING:

This article may make you hungry! Last month, Soroptimists Ellen Chapin, Peggy Hart, Marya Malkovich Rosenthal, and Laura McCourt spent the afternoon at Positive Images (PI), offering clients and drop-in staff the opportunity to learn the basics of Air Fryer and Crockpot cooking. Marya demonstrated the Air Fryer while the rest of the crew put the finishing touches on pre-prepared Crockpot dishes. The early dinner included Ellen's bar-b-que shredded chicken sandwiches, and Laura supplying chili and beef stew. Corn bread and Cole slaw were served with the roasted potatoes and chicken wings prepared by Marya during her demonstration. Peggy supplied elbow grease to a kitchen in much need of cleaning.





The clients at PI experience many chal-

lenges in achieving a healthy diet. The women have limited income, live in a food desert, and often do not have either the tools or the know how to ensure proper nutrition. In addition to supplying both Coplin and the Boulevard locations with a Crockpot and Air Fryer, our group developed and distributed a cookbook featuring easy, low-cost meals using both appliances. SIGP members donated cookbooks and storage containers so clients can "make and eat a recipe," "freeze the leftovers," and "trade a meal with another client."

All participants agreed this was a productive afternoon for everyone involved, demonstrating an area of need for this population of women in recovery. Participants in the activity graciously presented SIGP members with a card of thanks for the meals, information, and appliances. – *Laura McCourt*

### CIVILITY WORKSHOP

lesha D. Brown, SIA's Chief of Impact and Engagement, presented a Zoom workshop May 19 on the topic of Civility. She stated that the number-one reason why members have terminated their membership is due to a "lack of civility." Number two is "club functioning and operations," with number three being "not meeting expectations."

SIA is addressing the issue of civility since clubs are losing members at a large rate. She defined civility as interactions between people while demonstrating respectful behavior even when they disagree. Civility can be intentionally learned. There are basic rules for civil discourse. They are: be truthful; be attentive to tone; be conscious of facial expressions; be attentive to your opponent's point of view; process what is said; don't repeat yourself. Uncivil behavior includes: eye rolling; texting during Zoom; cliques; dominating; insisting on doing it the old way; shutting down ideas; being rigid; not listening.

There are ways a club can avoid incivility. Standards must be set. A member code of conduct with buy-in from all members can be instituted. Deepen connections with each other. Address instigators—if you see something, do something. Focus on the mission. Encourage niceties.

SIA is working on a member code of conduct. They are incorporating 10 important guiding principles of trust, respect, grace, communication, teamwork, leadership, diversity, inclusion, innovation, and decentralization. It will be launched in May 2023.

Our very own previous LYD Award winner, Tonesia Nesbitt, has won this national renewable scholarship program. It's serendipity that the word "dream" is in both SIGP's **Live Your Dream** Award and this national scholarship called the **America Dream Award.** She will be going to Washington, D.C., all expenses paid, to receive her award. Congratulations, Tonesia!

Getting into college is a huge achievement. Similar to SIGP's dream awards, the Scholarship America Dream Award is designed to help students keep moving toward their degree by providing awards that stay with them. Students who have completed at least a year of college can earn Dream Award scholarships of \$5,000 to \$15,000 per year, renewable for up to three years.

The awards are offered to students across the nation who find themselves in need of financial assistance while overcoming barriers ranging from physical disabilities, family matters to social inequalities.

Each eligible potential scholar must have at least a 3.0 GPA, financial need, demonstrate overcoming great obstacles to fulfill their educational endeavors and, while continuing to do so, they must also show exceptional leadership qualities, community involvement, and commitment—that's "our" Tonesia! The description fits her to a "T"!
