




For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

In August Brief Communion resumed meeting every Wednesday of the month at 1:30 p.m. Meeting in the conference room, participants remain seated for this brief time of spoken worship with communion. With the return of Brief Communion, the once a month

"Communion in Cars" event has been discontinued. Home visits with communion have started again for anyone who requests communion in the safety of their own home. During August, the structure and mission of an Altar Guild was finalized and an organizational meeting was held. Also during August we held a Blessing of the Backpacks during worship and almost thirty students from Pre-Kindergarten through graduate school brought their backpacks and received a special backpack tag to remind them that God goes with them as they attend school.





In June our GIFT families gathered for a big splash with a pool party at the Shiner Recreation Club pool. Vacation Bible School in early July filled our facility with children and volunteers eager to journey on the "Rocky Railway." The train theme began with a prize-winning float in the Half Moon Holidays parade. Throughout the week of VBS, both the participants and the many youth and

adult volunteers sang, played, and prayed their way through each day. Camp followed the next week with Pastor Chris and 7 youth traveling to Camp Chrysalis in Kerrville for week of fun and faith formation. As

summer ended, GIFT leaders met to prepare for the restart of our Wednesday evening education time. All these learning events were supported by donations and volunteers.



After many months at home, our quilting group met again on the third Tuesday and set out to craft quilts for Lutheran World Relief. In June, new volunteers joined in this ministry of caring. Over the summer, items for personal care kits were gathered, again for Lutheran World Relief. These kits will be assembled on Sunday

September 12, God's Work, Our Hands Sunday, the ELCA church-wide day of service. Kits and quilts will be sent to LWR in November. Our caring ministry to the food bank has resumed, with our congregation providing breakfast one Thursday a month to those who come to the Shiner Food Pantry at the Methodist Church. During the past months, our Hospitality Team was again able to provide food and serve for receptions and funeral luncheons. August finished with a 5th Sunday Covered Dish Dinner. Other fellowship groups such as Men's Fellowship also began meeting again during the summer.







Administration & Finance

After decades of using the same data management program, the office has now upgraded to a web-based management system. Our new system is titled Church 360⁰ Members. This product is actually from the same company, Concordia Technologies Solutions, that we have always used. The new program is stored on their server, secure and automatically updated. All the data from our former program has been transferred to Church 360⁰ Members. The office staff and a few others have completed onboarding training, but will continue to practice and learn over the coming months.

This program includes traditional person and household data, attendance, offering records, and report generating—the same functions as the former program. Because it is a brand new platform, it is more intuitive and, once learned, will speed office tasks. A new feature is the ability to generate a church directory and have it available for access by members. To get access, members must receive an individual invitation and must compose and use their own password. Members then would be able to update their own profile. Access would be limited only to contact information as would be found in a directory or you own personal data. The possibilities are exciting and promising, but learning something new is overwhelming. Please be patient as we move forward with this new technology! We look forward to better connecting and supporting members in the future.



Starting September 1, we will keep an expanded time that the office will be open: Mondays—9 am-Noon Tuesdays—9 am-4 pm Wednesdays—9 am-4 pm During these times the office entrance from Avenue B will be open for direct entry.



Work has begun on the 2022 budget. The challenge is that because of the pandemic, giving and budget information for the past two years is not especially helpful in planning our spending for 2022. We pray for faithful giving and good stewardship.

Loose change (or bills) are gathered as a special Noisy Offering on the last Sunday of the month for special



mission work. This past quarter Noisy Offerings were given to the Synod Assembly Offering (\$93.77), Shiner Community Food Pantry (\$107.48) and missionaries David & Alicia Brondos (\$132.64). Thank you! Our budget is the plan that we have made to guide our spending throughout the year. We

have a spending plan, but depend on offerings and donations for the funds needed to continue ministries. So far this year, we have kept spending within the guidelines of the 2021 budget.



Planned legacy giving enables churches and non-profit organizations to continue to exist, despite the uncertainties of offerings. In the past we have been blessed with bequests, oil leases and other special donations that have enabled both ministries and facility improvement. Special legacy giving is also the financial base that made our endowment fund possible.
