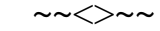

June Program – Rosepoint by Cambridge presented by Al and Jenny Melillo



Cambridge Glass Co existed for 85 years (1873-1958). Originally National Glass Co., changed locations, changes owners, moved to Cambridge OH in 1917, expanded and introduced colors, created the logo with the triangle and "C". Cambridge closed in 1958 and Imperial bought the molds. Cambridge introduced Rosepoint in 1934. It became very popular. They had matching silver, matching china, and all became popular as wedding gifts.

Al's parents were married in the late 1940s and included Rosepoint in their registry at a local jewelry store. They received 4 tea glasses and 4 water glasses. Al and Genny bought the matching vase at one of our shows. They now collect #3121 and #3500. Some of the pieces include liquor/cocktail glasses, wine glasses, 2 piece mayo, regular cream/sugar, individual creamer/suger, 2 handle cake plate (13 1/2 inch), bowl (12 1/2 inch), and more.
