One goal for this tour is that participants begin to experience the place we live in as Mnisota Makoce, the Dakota homelands. How has colonization impacted Dakota use and access to these places? How have Dakota people asserted a continuing relationship with these places? What happens when this history is unknown by Minnesotans. How can educators work to address this gap in knowledge and understanding?

This tour will provide participants with a more nuanced and complicated understanding of the place the Dakota people call home.
