In my profession,

I often get calls from long-time Christian Scientists who are now in medically-based nursing facilities and asking for help. They are constantly being encouraged to take medicine and physical therapy, and the atmosphere is filled with fear. This is materially-based healthcare. On the other hand, we have our Christian Science nursing facilities where you are met with an expectation of healing. The atmosphere is filled with love. Nothing is pushed on you, but you are supported in every way in your metaphysical work for healing as well as the work of your practitioner. This is spiritually-based healthcare. It is an easily recognized difference between thinking materially and thinking spiritually. You are expected to be healed and go home.

I recently looked over the Admissions packet for Desert View, and it includes a list of what Christian Science nurses do for you, as a patient, and a list of what they will not do. This second list includes some things that might make you think, why not? That would feel good (like a massage for example). And I realized we did not do this because of creed or church dogma but because it isn't necessary. We do not work in the material. We work in the spiritual. We get our healings spiritually, not materially.

Instead of being brought into an atmosphere potentially filled with fear, we are brought into a house built upon a rock with a foundation, God, and we are surrounded in an indestructible bubble of love.

In choosing a metropolitan area now in which to live,

I speak from experience for my Mother received wonderful Christian Science nursing care for three years at El Dorado Vista, the predecessor of Desert View. Our family visited her regularly and saw how she flourished there. They were always ready to help her get ready for outside visits, to share a meal with us or go to the hairdresser or dentist. They also taught me how to get her in and out of a car and assist her when in our home. At all times we always felt secure that she was receiving proper and loving care that supported her prayers. The quality care provided by that facility allowed us to feel comfortable if we left the state on vacation or for business travel.
