

Town of Stratton

Our Town is in need of individuals willing to participate in Community Service. Stratton is a town of only about 300 residents, yet there are many positions required to run and maintain our municipality adequately. Please contact the Town Office at (802) 896-6184 if you are interested in participating. The following positions need to be filled:

- 1) **Justice of the Peace** (duties include performing marriages [optional], serving as an Elections Official and participating in local quasi-judicial hearings such as assessment and tax appeals.)
- 2) **DVFiber Representative and Alternates (2)** (DV Fiber is a regional organization created to ensure that adequate communication infrastructure [e.g. high-speed internet service] becomes and stays available throughout our communities.)
- 3) **Assistant Forest Fire Warden** (A back up for the Fire Warden, who coordinates with the state to provide local burn permits, as well as other related duties.)
- 4) **Emergency Management Coordinator** (Maintains the Town's Local Emergency Management Plan [LEMP], which is in place to provide response guidance for emergency events such as flooding, storms, and outages that endanger residents and infrastructure.)
- 5) **Emergency Responders** (Fire Fighter and Rescue volunteers)
- 6) **Transfer Station Attendant back up** (A person who can fill in for the Attendant when needed.)
- 7) **Windham Solid Waste Management District Rep.** (Represents Stratton on the WSWMD Board of Directors, which oversees many of the regulations regarding solid waste acceptance by and removal from regional municipalities.)
- 8) **Windham Regional Commissioner (2)** (Represents Stratton on the WRC, which considers regional Town Plans and participates in helping localities with various community developmental planning issues.)
- 9) **Green Up Coordinator** (Tasked with organizing Green Up Day [usually the 1st Saturday in May] – this is the annual community event of collecting the accumulated trash along the local roads after the snow has melted off.)

Less-Formal positions needed include volunteers for organizing community events, such as the annual Town Meeting Potluck lunch and the annual Holiday Party, which we hope to restart after the COVID-19 hiatus, as well as volunteers to decorate the Town center for the holidays.
