Quilt block 9 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 9 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" unfinished



Color way: Scrappy

Fabric A: Scrappy Fabric B: Low Volume Light colors Fabric C: Scrappy

You will need:

 $1 - 6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle A scrappy fabric  $2 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle B low volume light fabric  $1 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle B low volume light fabric  $4 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle C scrappy fabric


This is very beginner friendly block and can whip up quickly. Sew with a **<u>SCANT</u>** <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seams.


- Step 1. Flying Geese: Flip and Stitch Method. Draw a diagonal line on backside of fabric C Place a square over one side of the rectangle B, right sides together.
- Stitch from corner to corner and then trim the excess fabric 1/4 inch away from your stitched line.
- Press. This is the first "wing" of your flying geese.
- Place the second square over the other side of the rectangle and stitch again, corner to corner.
- Trim the excess fabric. Ensure your geese measure  $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Press.

Step 2. Using fabric B - 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square, sew a <u>SCANT</u> <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam to one flying geese.

Step 3. Sew other flying geese to the 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric A square using <u>SCANT</u>  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam.

Step 4. Sew together the flying geese/corner section to the 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric A piece. Press seams.





Square up block to 9 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 9 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>".
