Luke 4:1-13



"Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written. One does not live on bread alone." Then he took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a single instant. The devil said to him, "I shall give to you all this power and glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I may give it to whomever I wish. All this will be yours, if you worship me." Jesus said to him in reply, "It is written 'You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Then he led him to Jerusalem, made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: 'He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you, and: 'With their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

1st Sunday Lent

Year C

Lk 4:1-13

Welcome to the desert! We go into the desert for spiritual training. We seek to learn and grow with Jesus. Of course, there are forces that would not want us to deepen our life with Christ. So, yes temptations will be hurled at us. Likely, our first temptation will be the one telling us we do not need to go, to not even go into the desert at all. Then we'll be tempted to give up and quit at the first challenge or with the first stumble we encounter. And then, we will likely be tempted to be preoccupied with ourselves, only viewing the training period as a chance to somehow get ahead of other people (Pride-Look at me!).

About temptations, what do they say but that 'You can take the man out of the city, but you can't take the city out of the man.' Going to the desert won't automatically take away our bad thoughts and sin. It may get us away from their 'reinforcements' or 'influencers', but what it is in our minds and hearts initially goes out there with us. Going to the desert may be an attempt to get out of the chaos of the world, but the world can follow us out into the desert tagging along in our thoughts, desires and memories. Well, Jesus is also tempted, like us, with all the things of the world (city) even in the desert! What is He up against? St John outlines the most basic temptations we encounter, when he tells us in 1 John 2:16-17 "For all that is in the world, 1)desires of flesh, 2)enticement for the eyes, and 3)a pretentious life, is not from the Father but is from the world. Yet the world and its enticement all pass away. But whoever does the will of God remains forever." The Devil throws every challenge at Jesus to distract and divert him from the Father's will, yet Jesus remains ever-focused on His Mission. Right before Jesus goes into the desert. He had just been baptized by John. It was revealed then, by the Father's voice, and in the company of the Holy Spirit (dove) that Jesus was His 'Beloved Son with whom I am well pleased" (Luke 3:21-22). The Father's joy resulted from His Son Jesus doing His Will (Father's Work). The Devil doesn't want that! So, as the Devil had turned against God already, now the Devil is quick to go after God's Son, like a terrorist and corrupt politician (even Tony Montana had the honorable rule of 'no wife no kids - leave them out of it!'). Specially, the devil comes after Jesus with bribing offers of 1) 'physical gratification', 2) 'power, kingdoms and rule' and 3) 'ultimate ego projection' (manipulate the Father for your own promotion). But isn't the word of God always on time, always providing a remedy? Jesus offers a response from scripture to each of the devil's bribes, simply quoting God's own Word back to him. It is not unique wisdom from Jesus. He simply offers God's pregiven words- those words manifest the Father's Will. That is a spiritual weapon we can use too: to have a handy 'scripture response' to whatever temptation or sin we may be plagued with at times. Write them down, memorize them or keep a handy rolodex of responses to whatever particular sin attacks you.

Yet, let's also look at the particular attacks that the Devil launches against Jesus. The Devil first appeals to the physicality of Jesus. Jesus is fasting, so the devil first tempts Him to please His appetite and produced sweet breads from the abundant stones in the desert. Then the devil insinuates that Jesus can become ruler of all kingdoms of the earth if He simply gives His soul to Satan. Then the devil presents a conniving plan for Jesus to force the Father's hand to 'save' Him spectacularly, through an egomaniacal display of self-importance- that Jesus plunge himself from the top of the Temple causing the Father to send in an army of angels to catch Him (note the grand, public nature of a manipulated miracle in the Holiest of Holy spots). These three temptations are what St John was summarizing as the worlds temptations: 1)instant physical gratification,2)covetousness for others' possessions and positions, and 3)pretentiousness (when we exalt our own ego's over God's will- basically worshipping our selves!)

Jesus' scriptural responses are that bread alone does not feed us (Deut 8:3), that God alone is to be worshipped (Deut 6:13), and that trying to control God (Deut 6:16) leaves a person with nothing but themselves. And nothing but oneself is truly nothing-Hell! As TS Eliot wrote in his play 'The Cocktail Party" (act 1 scene 3) "What is hell? Hell is oneself. Hell is alone......And nothing to escape to. One is always alone." (This aloneness is what the condemned rich man suffers in Luke's parable of the ignored poor man Lazarus. The rich man's condemnation combined all three of these si temptations- his physical comfort, his rapacious greed accumulating everything in sight, and his egotistical self-importance became the Hell of his own creation—Luke 16:19-31)

But Jesus brings the remedy to us. If Jesus represents anything to us, He represents constant communion with the Father and Holy Spirit, and constant communion with the Family of humanity. Jesus knows the emptiness of the world's (Devil's) promises. The Devil would have us project ourselves over others — our promotion even at the cost of another person. But Jesus says no! We are made to fulfill the Father's will, to glorify God and to serve our neighbor, created in His image. The desert reminds of all that we need: God, our relationship to Him and to His other children- one another. May we discover this in the desert and deepen our life with Christ and His People.
