Civic Report

San Mateo City Council Selects New District Maps

After hearing a robust community outreach campaign, the Council has selected a final map for how the city will be split into five districts for future elections. View the final map to explore the new districts.

The configuration decided on was determined to keep the most neighborhoods intact and best promote equitable representation by grouping together when possible, communities with similar ethnicity, income, education level, housing renter or owner status and other factors, thereby empowering potentially underrepresented demographics to elect a candidate to meet their needs.

Under the new voting system, residents falling within each district will get a single vote with which to elect a councilmember who will also be required to live within the district. The title of mayor will rotate yearly between councilmembers, as it does now.

It has yet to be decided who will represent each district, but candidates must live within the district they represent.

UFES

The UFES is now in stage 4, micropile installation.

Garbage Rate Increasing

Increased rates are going into effect in 2022. A 20-gallon cart for residents will go from \$15.59 to \$19.59, and a 32-gallon cart from \$24.93 to \$28.93. A 64-gallon bin goes from \$54.93 to \$56.93, and a 96-gallon bin from \$85.08 to \$87.08.

September 1st Minutes - On a motion duly made and seconded and approved by all Board Members the September 1st minutes were approved.

Financial /Steve Gross

- \$70,000 in our operating account.
- We paid out \$26,700 in the month of September.
- We have a \$1.5 million in the Cabana Funds/Reserve Account.
- \$2,200 was collected in dues for the month September. \$196,600 have been collected in total.
