AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS PROVIDING THAT THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BE AMENDED BY REVISING CHAPTER 20 "UTILITIES", ARTICLE II "WATER AND SEWER SERVICE", SPECIFICALLY SECTION 20-22 "WATER RATES" AND SECTION 20-24 "SEWER RATES", INCREASING WATER AND SEWER RATES; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (First Reading)

Ms. Adams presented the Council with the next several agenda items raising utility rates for water, wastewater, trash, and the convenience station, saying that the Utility Fund was operating in a deficit due to several different factors, including Capstone Metering going bankrupt and still owing the note on that loan, missed revenue from the bad meters, COVID-19, and supply chain interruptions. She added that the Finance Committee had recommended adding a surcharge to the utility bill now and a rate increase for the next budget year, but after discussion with the Mayor, it was proposed to just skip the surcharge and raise the rates so that citizens can begin preparing for that impact. She finished by stating that the city is well below utility costs compared to other nearby cities of similar size and the proposed rates would bring the city right in the middle of the highest and lowest rates in the area. Councilmember Johnson stated that he was reticent to raise rates, but acknowledged that the Utility Fund cannot continue to operate at a loss, and that the city's two wholesale customers should also reflect an increase in rates. The Council and City Manager continued discussion regarding the Convenience Station and the logistics of who can use the station and who is required to get a permit and pay per load.

Councilmember Toof opened discussion saying that he was in favor of dissolving the Cisco Development Corporation and reallocating a portion of the sales tax funds to infrastructure improvements. He thanked the CDC for the work they have undertaken up to this point, but said he felt that the city's needs had changed since the inception of the corporation, saying that the city needed infrastructure first, and then development would follow. Councilmember Bruner added that other cities are administrating economic development without the use of an economic development corporation. Councilmember Anaya had questions about what responsibilities the city would take over if the corporation was terminated and Mr. Jaworski indicated that he did not have that information available at the present time. Councilmember Johnson suggested tabling the item pending further information, clarifying that he would like concrete information, including numbers, before making a decision, but as of now, he is not in favor of terminating the Cisco Development Corporation.

WHEREAS, Tex. Civ. Stat. Ann. Transportation Code §311.07 provides that a home-rule municipality has the power and authority to vacate, abandon, and close any streets or alleys; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS:

Section 1: The east/west alley, being 12.5 feet wide and 177.44 feet long, within Block 118, S/D 3, OT CISCO, as depicted in McMorries & Company plat maps of the City of Cisco, Eastland, County, Texas, be permanently closed and that the dedicated rights-of-way be vacated as an alley rights-of-way or public thoroughfares of any kind or character.

Section 2: That the fee to the land in above described portions of said alley rights-of-way are hereby released and will revert to the adjacent property owners as provided by law; SAVE AND EXCEPT the City of Cisco RESERVES rights-of-way and easements for any and all existing utilities and/or drainage ways.

Section 3: That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after the date of its final passage.

- Requestor must provide map of easement or right of way being requested for abandonment.
- Payment of a non-refundable application fee must be submitted with completed application.

How much does it cost?







Narrative:

The proposed ordinance would raise the current water and wastewater rates to be closer to the rates charged by neighboring cities of similar size. Currently, Cisco's minimum utility bill is \$84.84; Eastland's minimum utility bill is \$132.35; Ranger's minimum utility bill is \$115.06; and Breckenridge's minimum utility bill is \$119.81. The ordinance proposes to raise water & sewer rates approximately 60%.

Impacts (Citizen, Services, Financial, Personnel):

Citizens would see the water portion of their monthly bill increased by approximately \$36.00. (If all the proposed rate increases were approved, the total increase to the utility bill would be approximately \$40.00) The city would use the increased funds to be able to no longer operate the Utility Fund in a deficit.

The proposed ordinance would raise the current convenience station surcharge by \$2.00 from the current amount of \$3.00 to the proposed amount of \$5.00. The Convenience Station is currently operating in a deficit; last month, the city collected \$3616.22 in convenience station surcharge fees, but was billed by Republic Services approximately \$10,000.00 to service the Convenience Station. The surcharge has been unchanged since 2021.

Citizens would see the convenience station surcharge on their monthly bill increased by \$2.00. (If all the proposed rate increases were approved, the total increase to the utility bill would be approximately \$40.00)

ORDINANCE NO. 0-2025-08

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, PROVIDING THAT THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BE AMENDED; SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER 16 "PARKS AND RECREATION", ADDING ARTICLE III "CITY PARKS", ADDING SECTIONS 16-80 "DEFINITIONS", 16-81 "GENERAL PARK RULES", 16-82 "CONDUCT OF PERSONS IN PARK", 16-83 "LITTERING AND DUMPING PROHIBITED", 16-84 "TOBACCO, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, DRUGS AND GLASS CONTAINERS PROHIBITED", 16-85 "TRAFFIC REGULATIONS", 16-86 "ENFORCEMENT", 16-87 "GENERAL PROVISIONS"; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS the City Council finds and determines that the City of Cisco needs city park rules and regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, THAT:

The City's Code Of Ordinances, Chapter 16 "Parks and Recreation" be amended to read as follows:

Article III CITY PARKS

Section 16-80 Definitions. The following words and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- A. *Alcoholic Beverages* are the same as defined in the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code, Section 1.04.
- B. *Controlled Substance* means any substance defined as a controlled substance by the Texas Controlled Substances Act (V.T.C.A., Health and Safety Code, Chapter 481).
- C. Dangerous Drug shall mean any substance defined as a dangerous drug by V.T.C.A., Health and Safety Code Section 483.001.
- D. Park shall mean a park, reservation, playground, splash pad, recreation center or any other area in the city owned, used or designated by the city and devoted to active or passive recreation.

Section 16-81 General Park Rules.

A. <u>Park Hours:</u> Except for events sponsored by the City or unforeseen emergencies, Parks will be open to the public from 7:00 a.m. until 30 minutes prior to sunset every day of the week.

B. <u>Unlawful Entry:</u> It shall be unlawful for any person, other than an employee of the city in the course of their employment, to be or remain in any Park outside Park hours, absent prior written approval from the City.

Section 16-82 Conduct of Persons in Parks.

It shall be unlawful for any person in a park to:

- A. Willfully or intentionally damage, destroy or disfigure any building, bridge, table, bench, fireplace, railing or paving material, water line, or other public utilities or parts or appurtenances thereof, signs, notices or placards, whether temporary or permanent, monuments, stakes, posts or other boundary markers, or other structures or equipment, facilities or park property or appurtenances, either real or personal or commit any acts of criminal mischief.
- B. Dig or remove any soil, rock, stones, trees, shrubs or plants or other wood or materials, or make any excavation by tool, equipment, or blasting, or in any other way injure or impair the natural beauty or usefulness of the Park.
- C. Damage, cut, carve, transplant or remove any tree or plant or injure the bark of any tree or plant.
- D. Willfully interfere with, disrupt or prevent the orderly conduct of any supervised play or amusement program being conducted by the city or other agency.
- E. Possessing and/or discharging any type of firework or explosive device.
- F. Build or attempt to build a fire except on Park grounds, unless using the designated fire pit or barbecue grill.
- G. Gamble or participate in or aid any game of chance.
- H. Allow any dog or pet within Park grounds to be unleashed at any time.
- I. Notwithstanding the above paragraph, no dog or pet will be permitted in the splash pad area or on any area covered in artificial turf.
- J. It shall be unlawful to fail to collect or dispose of any solid waste from a dog or pet on Park grounds.
- K. Hunt, stalk, trap, or kill any bird, animal or other wildlife in or upon Park grounds.
- L. Possess, carry, or discharge any firearm except as allowed by state law.
- M. Occupy the splash pad for any purpose other than playing in the water apparatus.
- N. Use confetti, balloons, silly string, or any other objects capable of being caught in the pumps within the splash pad area.

Section 16-83 Littering and Dumping Prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to:

- A. Throw, discard, dump, deposit or leave in and upon the grounds or waters of a public Park or recreation area any litter, garbage, trash, or debris except in receptacles provided for this purpose. Where public receptacles are not provided, all such litter, garbage, refuse and the like shall be picked up, carried away from Park grounds.
- B. Use the trash receptacles located within a Park for the disposal of waste generated anywhere other than within Park grounds.

Section 16-84 Tobacco, Alcoholic Beverages, Drugs, Glass Containers Prohibited.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to consume within Park grounds or bring into Park grounds Alcoholic Beverages, Controlled Substances, or Dangerous Drugs. It shall be unlawful for any person to consume tobacco products within Park grounds.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to bring into, have in one's possession, or leave any glass containers within Park grounds.
- C. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause a fire in a trash receptable or in any area of the park.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw away any lighted tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, matches or other lighted material, intentionally or by recklessly discarding a burning cigarette in the trash receptacles or any area of the park.

Section 16-85 Traffic Regulations.

It shall be unlawful for any person to:

- A. Fail to obey police or traffic officers or City employees instructing or directing traffic or parking whenever needed in the Parks and on city streets immediately adjacent thereto.
- B. Fail to observe carefully all traffic signs indicating caution, stopping, or parking on or near Park grounds.
- C. Park or station a vehicle on Park grounds other than in an established or designated parking area.

- A. The City of Cisco shall have the power to administer and enforce the provisions of this Ordinance as may be required by governing law.
- B. Enforcement of this Ordinance shall be the responsibility of the Code Enforcer, the Chief of Police, or their designee, and such other persons designated by the City.
- C. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance is subject to being banned from using any or all of the city parks as well as prosecution for criminal violations.
- D. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined a sum not exceeding \$500.00 plus court costs and administration fees as applicable. Each day that a provision of the Ordinance is violated shall constitute a separate offense. An offense under this Ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor.

Section 16-87 General Provisions.

If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or provision of this Ordinance is hereafter determined to be invalid or violative of the laws of the State of Texas or the Constitution of the United States by a court of appropriate jurisdiction, such finding of invalidity shall affect the continued enforcement only of the provision or provisions so determined to be invalid, it being the intent of the City Council of the City of Cisco that all other terms and provisions of this Ordinance not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective on July 1, 2025, and upon publication as required by law.







Citizens are given the opportunity to give public comment at Regular Council meetings, and Called Council meetings. Comments are limited to five (5) minutes. Because of provisions of the Open Meetings Act, members of the Council are not allowed to respond or take part in any discussion related to the comments made.

Texas Law Requires the following:

- ~A Council must allow every person who wishes to address the board on an agenda item to do so during or before the board's consideration of the item.
- ~ A council must allow public comment before or during the board's consideration of agenda items at all open meetings as defined by the OMA;
- ~A Council may establish reasonable rules for public comments including rules that limit the total time a member of the public can address the Council on a given item
- ~ A council may not prohibit public criticism of the board, including criticism of any act, omission, policy, procedures, program, or service; and
- ~ If a council adopts rules limiting the amount of time a member of the public may have to address the board, but does not use simultaneous translation equipment in a manner that allows the board to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously, then the board must provide at least twice the amount of time for non-English speakers who need a translator.
