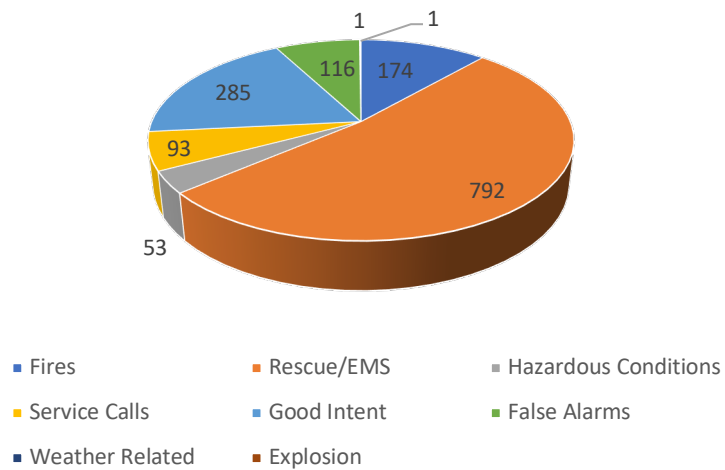


2021 Annual Incident Response

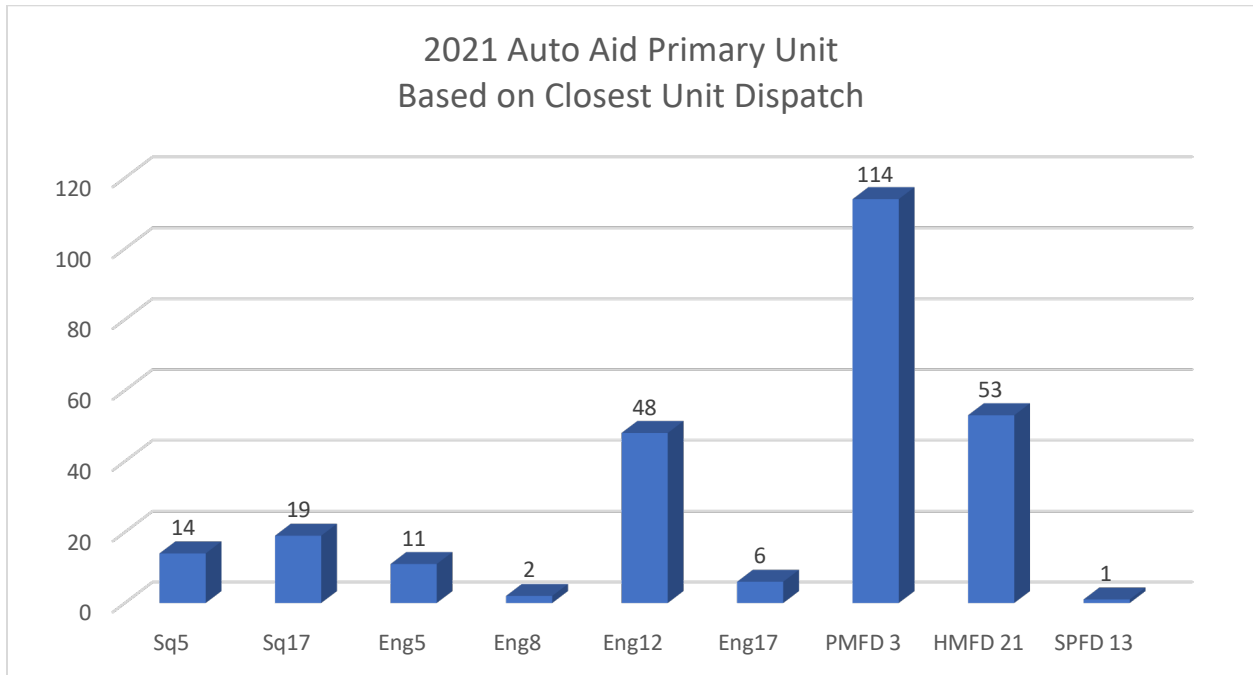
During 2021 Cumberland Road firefighters provided emergency services response 1515 times, which included fires, EMS/rescue responses, and non-emergency calls for service. These totals include automatic and mutual aid responses to neighboring departments.



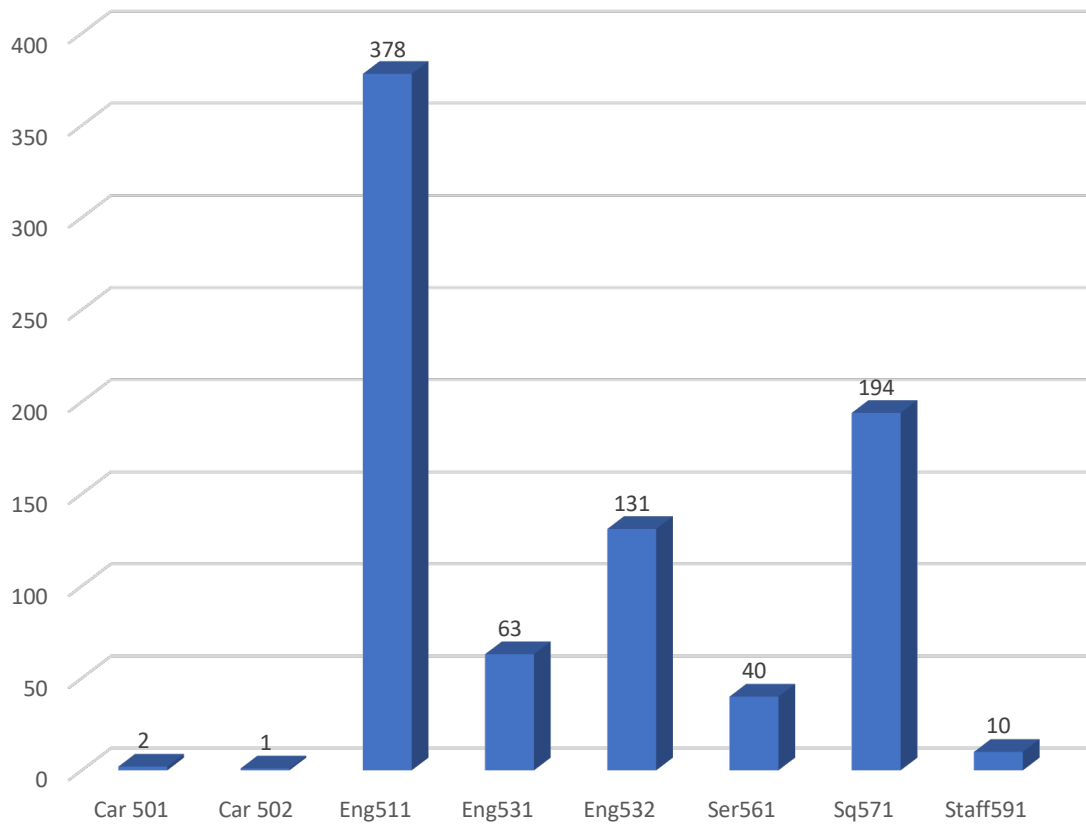
2021 Total Incident Type Summary

2021 Primary Unit Response in District CRFD Units



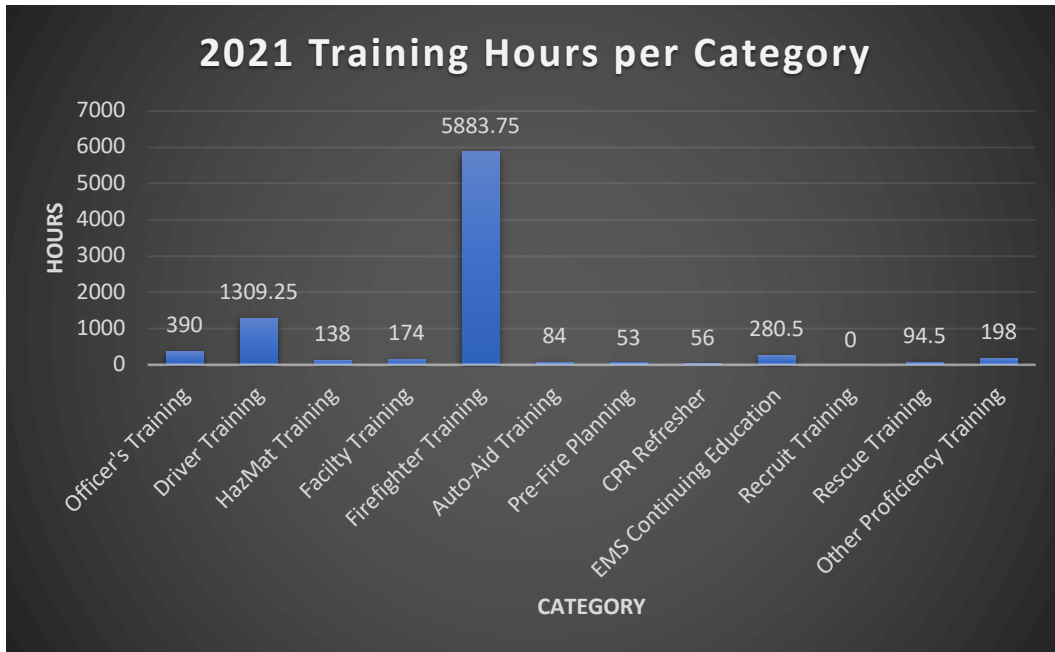
2021 Community Involvement

Partners with the NC Office of State Fire Marshal and Cumberland County Fire Marshal's Office, Cumberland Road Firefighter installed 108 smoke alarms for residents of the fire district. Firefighters also provided Fire and Life Safety education to our Churches, Daycare, Schools, and other community events, including Cumberland County Annual Safety Day. Community outreach, and Fire and Life Safety education, remain one of our highest priorities.



2021 ANNUAL TRAINING

Personnel, both part-time and volunteer members, completed a total of 8,661 hours of training in 2021.



Significant Purchases

In 2021 the department purchased a 2021 Spartan engine, replacing one of our aging engines. Our new engine carries 750 gallons of water, with a pumper capacity of 1500 gallons per minute. Along with the new engine the department purchased new fire attack fire hose and nozzles. Our new hose and nozzles can provide more gallons per minute of water on a fire and reduce stress on the firefighters with less wear and tear on the engines.

Upgraded Station Standby Generator

Approved and ordered in 2021, our 2022 Spartan FC94 / Hackney, Service / Rescue Unit is expected for delivery mid to late 2022. This unit will replace our existing unit, allowing us to carrier all required ISO equipment for a Service Unit while providing Medium Rescue Services.

As part of the Cumberland County Fire Protection Service District Grant Funding, the department will receive 25 new portable radios, replacing out-of-date, non-serviceable radios.

I would like to thank our Board of Director members for their continued support, and the men and women for their everyday work, response, and training, you have ALL played a part in our accomplishments, and commitment to our community.
