First Responder Awards Night

Edmund Kells - Richard A. Grennie American Legion Post 316 *Third Annual* DETECTIVE SALVADOR DAVILLA COMMUNITY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD to recognize members of the NYPD, FDNY and EMS, who have been nominated by their units for bravery above and beyond. This was at our meeting of October 21st 2019.



<u>Salvador Davila</u> who the award was named for - served in the U.S. Air force and from 1960 – 1965. Salvador joined the NYPD in1967attained the rank of detective and retired while serving with the120th Precinct in1987 He was a special investigator with the attorney general's office 1987 – 2005.

Salvador loved the New Dorp Community where he resided. He also loved soccer and helped found the Staten Island Soccer League and coached the sport at St Charles and St Josephs By the Sea.

Salvador joined the Post in 2004, became a Vice Commander in 2006 and ran the Post 316 Honor Guard and Rifle Squad. He served three years as Post Commander 2007 – 2010.

After the September 11, 2001 attack Salvador was working as a special investigator at ground zero collecting evidence. A few years later he became very ill from the debris in the air but remained a loyal active member of this Post until his passing on December 22, 2012.

AWARDS

Police Officer Yassir Zahroof with 3 years of service appointed October 11, 2016 was assigned to the 122 Precinct. He has an Associate Degree in Liberal Arts from the College of Staten Island. Police Officer Michael Lam two years of service appointed to the NYPD on January 04, 2017 and also assigned to the 122nd Precinct. Officer Lam attended the Baruch College where he obtained an Associate Degree in Business.

Both officers started on patrol with the third platoon and then the Anti- Crime team in September of 2019. Their primary job is to target persons of interest regarding crime and apprehend them in the act and aid the precinct Detective Squad in conducting investigations into major crimes.

Officer Zahroof is being recognized for his outstanding efforts with (45) arrests - (11) Felonies and (1) Excellent Police Duty Medal this year.

Officer Lam is being recognized for his outstanding efforts with has (88) Arrests- (22) Felony Arrests and his award by the 122 as the Cop of the Year for 2018.

First Awards Responder Night

On January 28, 2019 at 2049 hours, Engine 163 responded to an EMS run for an arrest at 41 Margaretta Court. They rescued a male patient in his bedroom, with no pulse and not breathing, The rescuers began CPR and continued until a viable pulse was established when EMS 22z arrived. The unit continued ventilations and assisted in removal and transport to Richmond University Medical Center.

Emergency Medical Technicians Michael Vale & Joshua Herrman were on assignment, when they noticed individuals with similar symptoms of feeling lightheaded, dizziness and headaches. The alarm on their CO meters immediately began go off with readings of 347ppm. They immediately evacuated the entire family and all other residents and alerted dispatch of a carbon monoxide incident.

They treated their patients with oxygen therapy and the family of six were then transported to Jacobi Medical Center Hyperbaric Treatment (hyperbaric physicians work with Jacobi's burn specialists to provide state of the art care for fire victims with smoke inhalation injuries).

For these actions Lieutenant Aron Ezegui recommended Emergency Medical Technicians Michael Vale and Joshua Herrman for a Meritorious Act-Accomplishment with Merit Award, for their act of personal bravery that resulted in the saving of a entire families lives.

Craig Bielawski, an off duty Firefighter, was having breakfast when the waiter came running in yelling fire. There was heavy black smoke towards Cedar Grove Avenue, so he went to see which house was burning. He realized it was in the beach community and ran around the back of the burning building which had heavy black smoke all around. He went through the side door and conducted a diligent search for victims but learned that all the women were outside.

He proceeded to take a garden hose trying to stop the fire from reaching the original building that was on fire focusing on one house. Traffic was stopped on New Dorp Lane. He called Staten Island Fire Dispatch; Engine 162 came and recommended transmitting a 2nd Alarm. He provided progress reports but later was transported to the hospital with smoke inhalation and a minor burn to his left ear.



Taps For a Passing Post Member



On December 22 Elias Arout, 89, of Grymes Hill, Staten Island, passed away. He was a Post member for 40 years and served as Richmond County Commander 1990 - 1992. He had 26 years of service, with the US Naval Air Reserve, including two years of active duty during the Korean Conflict, as a photographer, 1st class. He was born in Grant City, graduated from Alexander Hamilton Vocational in Brooklyn, and worked for 20 years as a police officer for the New York Housing Authority, retiring in 1980. Elias had been appointed by Mayor Ed Koch as the New York City Taxi And Limousine Commissioner for Staten Island and retired after serving 27 years. He was a co-founder and past president of the non-profit Project Hospitality and longtime member of the Knights of Columbus Council 1662 in Great Kills, Kells-Grennie American Legion Post 316 and the North Shore Democratic Association.

He leaves behind his wife, Margaret of 64 years; his children, Stephen, David, Raymond, Elise, Carlos; and five grandchildren. He will be remembered as a kind, gentle person who had a deep love for his family and friends.
