Assistance with cleaning, laundry and errands. Clients must meet certain eligibility criteria.

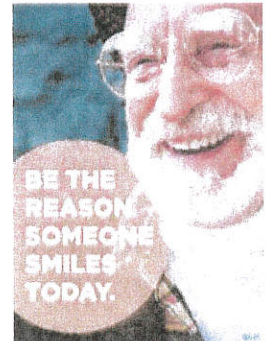


**Meals on Wheels:**

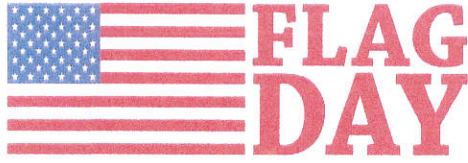

DID YOU KNOW?



Flag Day commemorates the date in 1777 when the United States approved the design for its first national flag. Each year, Flag Day is celebrated on June 14.

While, in 1916, President Wilson proclaimed June 14 as the official date for Flag Day, and in 1949 US Congress permanently established the date as National Flag Day, its origins are even more historic.

Bernard J Cigrand, a Wisconsin teacher, who in 1885 encouraged students to observe June 14 as “Flag Birthday.” He later wrote an essay published in a Chicago newspaper that urged Americans to proclaim this date as the day to celebrate the flag.

In 1888 William T Kerr founded the American Flag Day Association of Western Pennsylvania.

A lesser-known claim is that of George Morris of Connecticut, who is said to have organized the first formal celebration of the day in Hartford in 1861.

Each year the President delivers an address to proclaim the week of June 14 as National Flag Week, and all Americans are encouraged to fly US flags during that week.

ELDER JUSTICE

Elder justice is more than just about ensuring instances of elder abuse are reported, and holding those who victimize older adults accountable, it's also about understanding the root causes of abuse and neglect, as well as positioning appropriate services and supports to reduce the risk of abuse before it happens. So, too, it's also about fully understanding why criminals target older adults so that effective interventions can be developed to protect all Ohio consumers.

**Additionally, elder justice requires a fundamental change in how our society thinks about older people.**

Through coordinated efforts of agencies and organizations, progress is being made to better assess trends with elder abuse and neglect and to take action more consistently to address these issues. Effectively challenging and changing ageist attitudes — which may prevent older adults from living their lives to the fullest potential. The ultimate goal: ALL Ohioans have the ability to participate fully in communities and live free from the fear of abuse, neglect, and exploitation.
