Henry "Hank" Marker, 86, of Sebewaing, died Tuesday morning, October 26, 2004, at Tendercare of Cass City following a brief illness. He was united in marriage to Kathleen H. Wilder on October 17, 1936 in Sebewaing. He had been employed at the Weld Rite Company in Bay City for 33 years before retiring in 1983. He then had been employed at Ted Schmidt's in Unionville for several years. Henry was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church and the Sebewaing American Legion Post No. 293. He served in the U.S. Navy Sea Bees during World War II.
